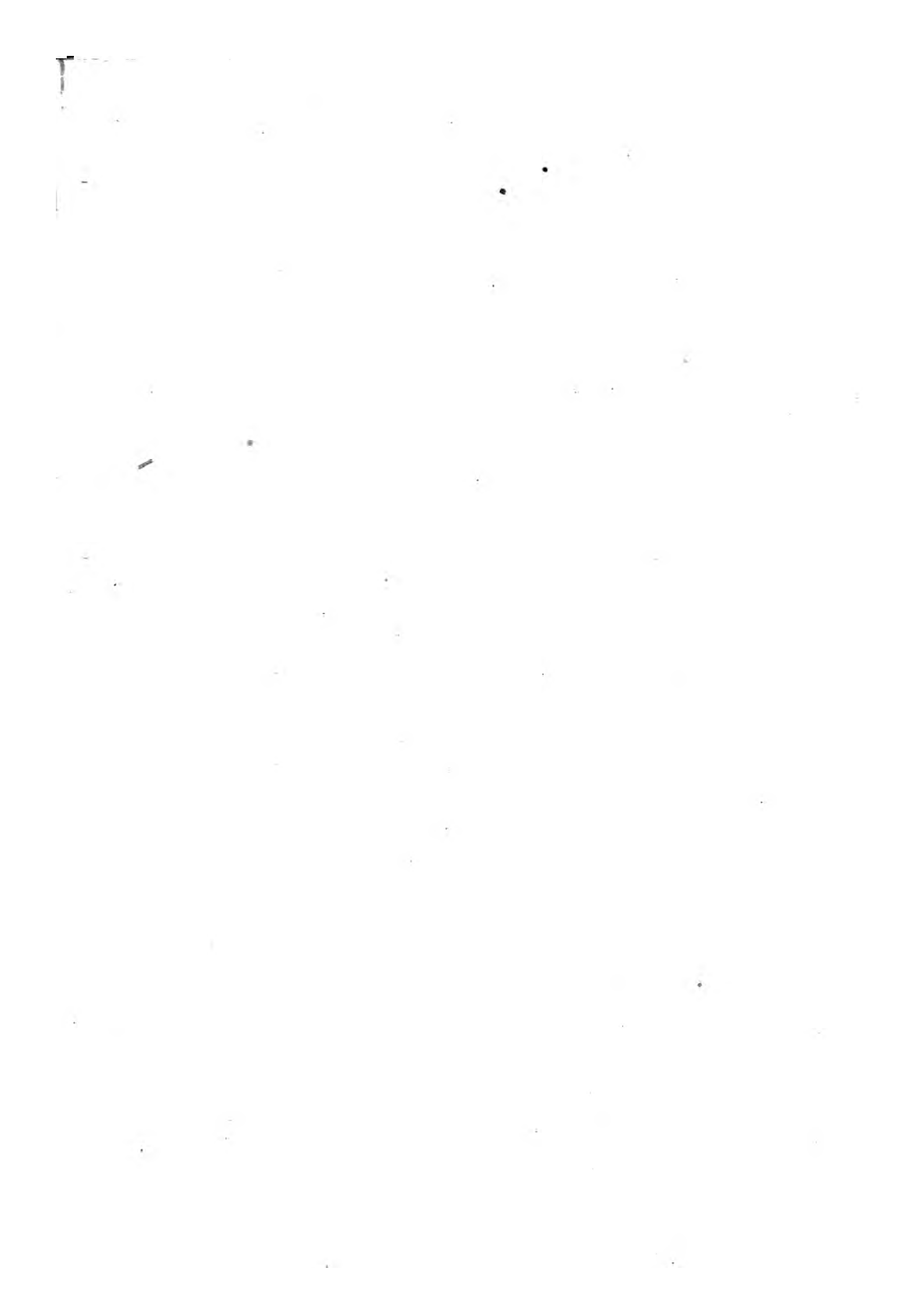

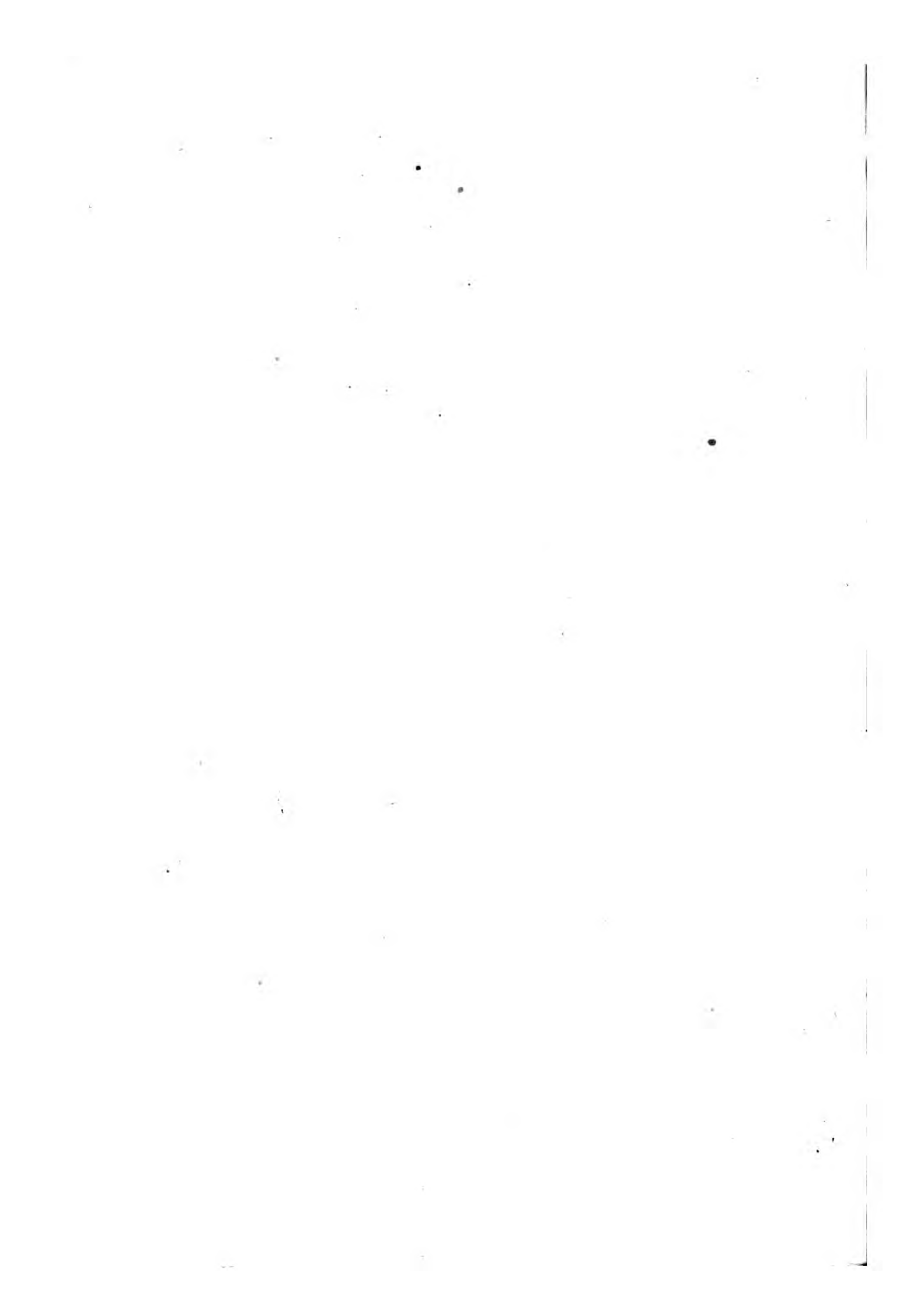

EXETER;

ITS EARLY HISTORY, RELIGIOUS EDIFICES, PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND INSTITUTIONS, ETC.,

EXETER, a City and County within itself, and the capital of Devonshire, lays claim to great antiquity, and played a conspicuous part in the early history of the nation. It was in later times the centre of an extensive trade and the seat of flourishing manufactures, but in its modern aspect its fame rests more upon its being the chosen residence of a large number of gentel families and the consequent presence of good society. Its position is eminently picturesque and salubrious, being situated on a commanding height overlooking the valley of the Exe, and surrounded by suburbs offering the most varied and delightful scenery. The description given of the city about two hundred years ago, by Richard Isacke, erst Chamberlain of the same, would imply that even then Exeter was looked upon as a most desirable place of abode. The writer quaintly says:—"This City is pleasantly seated upon a Hill among Hills, saving towards the Sea, where 'tis pendant in such sort, as that the Streets (be they never so foul) yet with one shower of Rain are again cleansed; Nature her self seeming to be the chief Scavenger thereof. Very beautiful is the same in building, and for considerable Matters matchable to most Cities in *England*." The distance from the sea-coast is about twelve miles, and the communications therewith by rail form a series of the most agreeable rides to be met with perhaps in the kingdom. As the seat of the Bishopric of the extensive diocese of Devon and Cornwall, and containing a greater number of parish churches than most cities, the Cathedral dignitaries and other clergymen of the Establishment, with their families, add much to its character of gentility; whilst the many admirable institutions at the disposal of the citizens, and the facilities afforded them of acquiring information, combine to give Exeter the reputation of a literary city. Its geographical position is 50° 45' north latitude, and 30° 40' west longitude; and the distance from London—by road, 173 miles; by railway, 194.

The origin of the city has given rise to much learned discussion, but the prevalence of early British names points to the fact of its having existed as a place of some importance anterior to the Roman invasion. Its present appellation comes to us from the Saxon times, Cerdic, the founder of the kingdom of Wessex, having built a castle here, to which he gave the name of *Exan Caestre*—the Castle on the Exe—subsequently corrupted into Excester and Exeter. The Danish rovers made frequent raids upon the city, and it had its full share of troubles under the Norman rule. The citizens having revolted against the oppression of the times, the stern Conqueror caused a strong castle to be built here, and gave it into the custody of some of his knights. In the struggle between Stephen and the Empress Matilda, the city was garrisoned on behalf of the latter by the Earl of Devon, and the citizens having admitted Stephen's troops the Earl retreated to the castle, which he defended for three months. Henry II. transferred the castle to the citizens, in recognition of their fidelity to his mother, the Empress Matilda; and during the subsequent reigns the city was frequently visited by royalty. In the wars of the Roses, Exeter took an active part, and Edward IV., with his Queen and the infant Prince, visited

the city, when the monarch bestowed a Sword of State upon the Mayor. The accession of Richard III. was viewed with much disfavour by the citizens, but they were overawed by a Commission which the King sent to the West, in which many families of distinction suffered. Perkin Warbeck, in the reign of Henry VII., landed in Cornwall, and having advanced his pretensions to the throne as Richard Duke of York, son of Edward IV., he assembled an army of 6,000 men and marched them to Exeter, which he attempted to take by storm, but after being several times repulsed by the citizens he was at length compelled to abandon the siege and take to flight, some of the principal among his followers being executed at Southernhay, and others presented to the King with halters round their necks. His majesty was so gratified with the loyalty displayed by the citizens that he presented them with the sword he was wearing, and renewed their charter. The tumults consequent on the suppression of the monasteries and the inclosure of the common lands, once more brought trouble on the citizens, and the insurgents from the country districts attempted to scale the walls and burn the gates, finally resorting to a blockade for the purpose of reducing the city. The arrival of some troops, on the 6th August, 1549, dispersed the besiegers, and the citizens again had a royal message thanking them for their fidelity, and the day was set apart to be kept annually as a day of thanksgiving. The persecutions under Henry VIII. and Queen Mary furnished several victims at Exeter, and in the preparations made to repel the invasion threatened by Philip of Spain, the citizens showed such alacrity that Queen Elizabeth sent them a letter in which she thanked them for their loyal and patriotic behaviour, and granted them the motto, *Semper Fidelis*. During the wars between Charles I. and the Parliamentary leaders, Exeter was seized by the Earl of Devon (then Lord-Lieutenant of the County) on the part of the Parliament, and the city having been garrisoned was placed under the command of the Earl of Stamford. On the defeat of that nobleman by the royalist troops at Stratton, he returned to Exeter and prepared the city for a siege. Sir John Berkeley commenced a blockade in July, 1643, which was pertinaciously continued until the Parliamentary losses on the North coast suggested the advisability of surrender on the part of the Earl of Stamford, and Sir John Berkeley was appointed governor. The reputation for loyalty enjoyed by Exeter induced Queen Henrietta to come here for security, and Bedford House was prepared for her Majesty's reception, and here was born the Princess Henrietta Maria, afterwards Duchess of Orleans. The Corporation presented the Queen with £200, but the Earl of Essex marching westward with his army, she took to flight, and, proceeding to Falmouth, embarked for France. King Charles and the Prince of Wales subsequently arrived in the city, and the Corporation presented them with £500 and £100 respectively. After his successful expedition into Cornwall, the King again visited Exeter, on his way to Oxford. Sir Thomas Fairfax, after the battle of Naseby, was appointed governor of the western forces, and in the early part of 1646 Exeter was besieged by the Parliamentary army, and on the 9th of April Sir John Berkeley surrendered it into their hands, stipulating as one of the conditions that the infant Princess and her household should have liberty to move to any part of England or Wales. The return of the exiled royal family was gladly hailed in Exeter, and on the proclamation of Charles II., on the 11th May, 1669, the city conduits ran with claret, and the Corporation presented the King with a piece of plate worth £300, the Queen Mother with one worth £300, and the Princess Henrietta Maria with another worth £200. On his return from visiting the new Citadel at Plymouth, Charles II. stayed here, and was entertained at the Deanery. His Majesty then promised to present the citizens with a portrait of the Princess Henrietta Maria (then the Duchess of Orleans), and the picture was forwarded in the following year, and now adorns the Guildhall.

The landing of the Prince of Orange at Torbay, 5th November, 1688, brings Exeter again under notice. The Mayor, Sir Thomas Jefford, having been but recently knighted by King James II., was naturally disposed to favour the cause of the unhappy monarch, and he refused to admit the Prince's ambassadors; but the feeling of the people being in favour of the new order of things the gates were thrown open, and during the day numbers of soldiers continued to pass into the city. On the following day the Prince of Orange arrived here with a magnificent cavalcade, and was entertained at the Deanery, where, after offering thanks in the Cathedral for his safe arrival, he held his court. A contemporary record gives the following account of the military pageant with which William entered the city:—"The Earl of Macclesfield with 200 horsemen, most of them English nobles and gentlemen, on Flanders steeds, in bright armour; 200 negroes attendant, wearing embroidered caps with white fur and plumes of feathers; 200 Finlanders clothed in beaver skins, with black armour and broad swords; 50 gentlemen, and as many pages, to support the Prince's standard; 50 led horses, with two grooms to each; two stage coaches; the Prince on a milk-white horse, in a complete suit of white armour, a plume of white ostrich feathers on his head, and 42 running footmen by his side; 200 gentlemen and pages on horseback; 300 Swiss guards; 500 volunteers, with two led horses each; the Prince's guards, 600 armed *cap-a-pie*; the remainder of the army, with fifty wagons laden with cash; and 120 pieces of cannon." After some hesitation the gentry of the county joined William's standard, and the Prince entered into a compact with them to uphold the Protestant religion, and maintain the government and the liberties of the people as founded by Magna Charta, and a document to this effect was drawn up and signed in the Cathedral.

The more peaceful times which followed the reign of William III. leave little more to be said respecting Exeter so far as national matters are concerned. The Duke of Marlborough reviewed the troops here on the 18th October, 1738; and on the appearance of the combined fleet off Plymouth, in 1779, the French prisoners of war were marched from thence to Exeter and lodged in the County Prison under guard of a regiment of volunteers. In August, 1789, George III. with his Queen and the royal children visited the city. Some years later, when Napoleon I. threatened an invasion of England, active measures were taken to fortify Exeter. The city has been the scene of several serious riots, notably those in the years 1796, 1800, 1801, and 1847—all, however, partaking of the character of food riots.

The river Exe, which takes its rise on Exmoor, in Somersetshire, was formerly navigable to the city; but in consequence of some dispute between the citizens and the Courtenay family (Earls of Devon), who claimed the fishery and the exercise of certain rights over the river, they obstructed its course by the erection of a weir just above Topsham, thus necessitating the cutting of the Canal, for which an Act of Parliament was obtained in the reign of Henry VII. In 1825 the Corporation of the city widened and deepened its channel, and extended it to Turf, thus making its entire length five miles. A bridge was built over the Exe in 1250, and this structure having been destroyed by a flood, another bridge was built higher up the river in 1775. This erection was similarly destroyed, and on its site, in 1778, the present Exe Bridge was built.

It has been stated that extensive manufactures once existed in the city, the staple of which consisted in woollen fabrics and serge; and some idea may be formed of their magnitude from the fact that in the year 1676 upwards of £50,000 worth of these goods were disposed of here weekly—a sum representing far greater money value than at present. The closing of the Continental ports against English goods by the First Napoleon gave the death blow to this once flourishing trade, and it has gradually declined, until scarcely a vestige of it now remains in Exeter. But if

these branches of industry have departed from the city, its fertility of resource as the metropolis of the two westernmost counties, as well as being a place of acknowledged gentility, has developed other varieties of manufacture which sustain its ancient reputation. Exeter has long enjoyed a well-established celebrity for superiority in Coach-building, and this branch of business has of late years received a fresh impetus from the enterprise of the firm of Standfield and Crosse, who have succeeded in producing several novelties in vehicles which are much esteemed and admired. In other branches of trade a corresponding activity has been manifested. Engineering, brass, iron, and lead founding, are extensively represented by the respective firms of Vicary, Taylor and Bodley, Parkin, Garton and King, James, E. Rowe and Co.; and the erection of extensive works by the Messrs. Edwards and Sons, hat manufacturers, indicates increased prosperity in this important branch of business. Paper Making is largely carried on both here and at other parts along the banks of the Exe, whose waters offer unceasing motive power, and seem to invite enterprise.

A mint was established here in early Saxon times, and money coined under several of our kings, especially John and William III. The existence of this privilege is perpetuated in the name borne by one of our streets, namely, The MINT.

The ancient boundaries of the city are almost obliterated by modern improvements, but here and there portions of the old walls still obtrude among the erections of the present day. The most conspicuous are the remains of the venerable Castle, which, having survived the assaults of time from the days of the Conqueror to the Commonwealth, was dismantled by the Parliamentary General, Fairfax, and the only portions now standing to remind the present generation of feudal times are the entrance-gate and tower and surrounding walls. THE CASTLE of the present day is a very common-place looking building, and answers the purposes of a County Assize Hall and Sessions House.

CHURCHES, CHAPELS, PUBLIC BUILDINGS, Etc.

The Cathedral Church of St. Peter is one of the noblest religious edifices in the kingdom, and occupies the site of a Benedictine Abbey founded by Athelstane in the year 932. In the time of Edward the Confessor, the seat of the Bishopric was removed by his Chancellor, Leofric, from Crediton to Exeter, and the erection of the Cathedral was begun in 1111 by Bishop Warelwast. During the siege of the city by King Stephen's troops the Cathedral was very much injured, and after successive generations of repair, the edifice, in its present form, was begun by Bishop Quivil in 1280, and finished by Bishop Grandison in 1360. It is cruciform, consisting of nave and two aisles, choir with two aisles, and two transepts 140 feet long; the length of the Cathedral is 408 feet, and the towers are 145 feet high. The west front is covered with canopied niches, containing elegant carved statues of the Twelve Apostles, Kings, Bishops, Knights, Crusaders, &c.; and the window which adorns this front is one of the grandest specimens of stained-glass decoration extant. The south tower contains 11 bells, and is the heaviest peal in the kingdom, the great bell weighing 12,500lbs., or about 5 tons 11 cwt., there being only one bell heavier in the country, Great Tom of Oxford, which weighs 7 tons 6 cwt., its namesake at Lincoln weighing 5 tons 8 cwt. The work of restoration now being carried out will effect some modification of the interior arrangements, and renders present description premature. Services daily at 7 a.m. (7-30 during the winter months) in the Lady Chapel, and at 10-30 a.m. and 3 p.m. in the Choir; Sunday afternoon Service in the Nave.

Adjoining the Cathedral is the Bishop's Palace, which was principally rebuilt in the Tudor style by Bishop Phillpotts in 1845. The Deanery is near the Palace Lodge, and occupies the site of an Augustine Nunnery.

ALLHALLOWS CHURCH, Goldsmith Street, is a small ancient building, with belfry and one bell. The church, which was closed from 1720 to 1822, was repaired and re-opened in the latter year. The living is valued at £80 per annum, and is in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter. Rector, Rev. W. Parkhouse. Services—Sunday, 10-45 a.m. and 6-30 p.m.

ALLHALLOWS ON THE WALLS (Bartholomew-yard), a building in the Perpendicular style, was erected in 1845, and the tower superadded in 1849. The living is valued at £100 per annum, and is in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter. Rector, Rev. J. G. Pearse. Sunday, 10-45 a.m., 3 p.m. and 7 p.m.; Wednesday, Friday, and Holy days, 10-30 a.m., 8 p.m.; other days, 8 a.m.

BEDFORD CHAPEL (Bedford Circus) is a plain brick edifice consisting of north, south, and centre aisles, with small bell turret. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the patronage of trustees. Rector, Rev. W. E. Jackson. Sunday, 10-45, 6-30; Wednesday, 7 p.m.

SAINT DAVID'S is a building in the Doric style surmounted by a bell-turret with six bells. It was erected in 1816, on the site of a former church, and was much enlarged in 1839. The living is valued at £174, and is in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter. Rector, Rev. J. T. Toye. Sunday, 10.45, 3; Wednesday, Friday, and Holy days, 10-45 a.m.; other days, 8 a.m.

ST. MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS (Mount Dinham) is a fine new church, in St. David's parish, at the entrance to the Exeter Free Cottages. It is in the Early Decorated style, and is surmounted by a spire 220 feet in height. The Rev. J. T. Toye is the Incumbent. Sunday, 10.45, 7; week days, 7 p.m.

ST. EDMUND'S (Edmund-street) occupies the site of an ancient structure known formerly as the Chantry on the Bridge, or St. Edmund's on the Bridge—owing to its proximity to the old bridge over the Exe. It was rebuilt in 1834, and has a tower containing eight bells. Living valued at £187, in the patronage of Mrs. Alleyne. Rector, Rev. A. O. G. Alleyne. Sunday, 11, 3.45, and 7; Wednesday and Friday, 8 p.m.; Holy days, 11, 8.

ST. JOHN'S (Fore-street hill) is an ancient building, with tower containing six bells and a projecting illuminated clock. On the removal of the Church of St. George the Martyr from South-street, in 1843, the bells and monuments were removed hither, and the parishes united. The joint living is valued at £212 per annum, in the patronage, alternately, of the Lord Chancellor and the Dean and Chapter. Rector, Rev. C. R. N. Lyne. Sunday, 10.43, 6.30; Thursday, 7.15 p.m.

ST. PETROCK'S, situated partly in High-street and partly in the Cathedral yard, has a tower, with a clock projecting into High-street. The living is united with that of St. Kerrian (in North-street), and is valued at £212 per annum, in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter. Rector, Rev. H. F. Cann. Sunday, 10.45, 6.30.

ST. LAWRENCE'S (High-street) is a small edifice with tower containing one bell, and a handsome stained-glass window. Living valued at £135 per annum, in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter. Rector, Rev. J. G. Davis. Sunday, 10.45, 6.30; Thursday, 7.15 p.m.

ST. MARTIN'S (Cathedral yard) is a small ancient building, with tower containing one bell. The living is valued at £77 per annum, and is in the patronage of the Dean. Rector, Rev. J. W. Hedgeland. Sunday, 10.45, 6.30.

ST. PANCRAS (Pancras-lane) is of small dimensions, being 46½ feet in length and 16 feet in width. The living is valued at £66 per annum, and is in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter. Incumbent, Rt. Hon. and Rev. Lord Cole. Sunday, 10-45.

ST. MARY ARCHES (Mary Arches-street) is a spacious edifice, with tower and three bells; the nave and aisles are separated by very ancient massive columns. The living is worth £162 per annum, and is in the patronage of the Bishop of Exeter. Incumbent, Rev. A. H. Hamilton. Sunday, 11-10, 3 (in winter 6); Wednesday and Friday, 11-30; Holy days, 11

ST. MARY MAJOR (Cathedral yard) is a fine building, with a spire 151 feet in height. Interiorly it comprises chancel, nave, and south aisle, and will accommodate a congregation of over 500. The living is valued at £191 per annum, and is in the patronage of the Bishop of Exeter. Incumbent, Rev. C. C. Turner. Sunday, 10.45, 3, and 6-30; Wednesday, Friday, and Holy days, 11.

ST. MARY STEPS (bottom of Stepcote hill) is an ancient church of small dimensions, with a tower containing four bells, and a curious clock with mechanical figures which strike the hours. The living, which is in the patronage of Mrs. Strother, is valued at £179. Rector, Rev. J. B. Strother. Sunday, 11-30, 3, and 7; week days, 11, and 8 p.m.

ST. OLAVE'S (Fore-street) was formerly used by the French refugees as a Huguenot church. It is an ancient building, and once formed an appendage to Battle Abbey. The living is valued at £81 per annum, and is in the patronage of the Lord Chancellor. Rector, Rev. John Ingle. Sunday, 11-30, 3-15 and 7; week days, 5-15; Holy days, 11.

ST. PAUL'S (Paul-street) is a neat edifice with tower and one bell. The living is valued at £115 per annum, and is in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter. Incumbent, Rev. H. Bramley. Sunday, 10.45, 6.30; Holy days, 10.45.

ST. SIDWELL'S (Sidwell-street) is a fine building, surmounted by an octagonal spire containing a magnificent peal of eight bells. It consists of nave, chancel, north and south aisles, the clustered columns of the original edifice forming conspicuous features in the ornamentation. The living is valued at £300 per annum, in the patronage of the Vicar of Heavitree. Rector, Rev. J. L. Galton. Sunday, 10.30, 3, 7.30; week days, 10.30, 7.

ST. STEPHEN'S (High-street) is of very ancient date, but has been rebuilt and re-arranged in modern times. It has a tower with three bells, surmounted by an octagonal turret. The living is valued at £54 per annum, and is in the patronage of the Bishop. Incumbent, Rev. J. W. Hedgeland. Sunday, 10.45, 6.30; Holy days, 10.45; Wednesday, 7.15.

HOLY TRINITY (South-street) is a spacious Gothic edifice, with a turret containing one bell, and a clock in front. The living is valued at £111 per annum, and is in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter. Incumbent, Rev. G. H. Shield. Sunday, 10.45, 3, 6.30; Holy days, Wednesday, Friday, 11.

ST. JAMES'S (near the commencement of Tiverton road, St. Sidwell's) is the church for a district formed out of the extensive parish of St. Sidwell. It was built in 1836, and its enlargement or rebuilding is now under consideration. The living is in the patronage of the Vicar of Heavitree. Incumbent, Rev. E. N. Dumbleton. Sunday, 10.30, 3 and 7; Holy days, Wednesday, Friday, 10.30 and 7; other days, 9.30 and 7.

ST. LEONARD'S (end of Holloway-street) is a handsome Grecian edifice, situated on an eminence, and entered by a lofty portico supported on two massive columns. The living is valued at £260 per annum with residence. Rector, Rev. G. Porter. Sunday, 10.45, 3 (summer 3 and 6.30); Holy days and Wednesday, 11; Friday, 10.

ST. THOMAS THE APOSTLE (Cowick-street, St. Thomas) is a neat edifice with tower containing six bells, and clock. The interior arrangements comprise chancel, nave, and aisles. The living, value £230, is in the gift of J. H. Buller, Esq. Vicar, Rev. W. C. Gibbs. Sunday, 10.45, 3, 6.30; Wednesday and Friday, 11.

There are also within the city several minor churches, either attached to institutions, or serving as Chapels of Ease. Among these are—*St Anne's Chapel*, attached to the alms-houses of that name, top of Sidwell-street; *St. John's Hospital*, in connection with the School in High-street; *St Mary Magdalen*, Chapel of Ease to St. Mary Major; and *Wynard's Chapel*, belonging to that charity, Magdalen-street. The suburban churches will be noticed under their respective localities.

INDEPENDENT (Southernhay). This is a fine building in the Early Decorated Gothic style, with a lofty tower and spire. The interior arrangements are of a very superior description, and capable of accommodating 1000 persons. Sunday, 10.45, 6.30; Monday and Wednesday, 7; Rev. D. Hewitt.

The **GUILDHALL** (High-street) is a venerable relic of fifteenth century architecture, with the upper part projecting over the footway, and supported by massive columns. At the entrance is the Police-office, and the downstairs apartment is allotted to the purposes of a Common Hall, in which are held the daily sittings of the magistrates, the city assizes and sessions, election nominations, and other city business. The hall (although not spacious, in the modern acceptance of the term) is lofty, with arched roof, and wainscotted sides divided into panels with carved mouldings, the cornices of which are emblazoned with shields containing the arms of the city, various mayors, and ancient trade incorporations. Within the panels are some fine portraits, viz., the Princess Henrietta Maria (by Vandyke), General Monk, George III., Chief Justice Pratt, besides several local celebrities. The upstairs apartments comprise the Grand Jury Room, Council Chamber, &c.

ALBERT MEMORIAL MUSEUM, Free Library and Reading Room (Queen-street). This is one of the noblest institutions of the kind in the kingdom, and was built to commemorate the many amiable qualities which distinguished the Consort of Queen Victoria. It is a handsome stone building, presenting a frontage of 140 feet, and a depth in the southern wing of 60 feet. The cost of erection (including purchase of site) was £10,000, raised by subscription, and aided by a Government grant of £500

towards the establishment of a School of Art, which forms a feature in the institution. The specimens in the various departments of natural history, geology, science and art, manufactures, and foreign curiosities, are of the most extensive and varied character; and are being continually added to from the collections of the neighbouring gentry and the trophies of travel. The arrangement of the various sections is perfect, and enables the visitor to take systematic observation of the entire Museum. The Library contains about 10,000 volumes in all departments of literature, and is available to every ratepayer, and to every resident not a ratepayer on obtaining the signature of two burgesses. The news room is well supplied with the leading metropolitan and provincial papers, and, with the reading room, is open to the public from ten a.m. to ten p.m. daily (excepting Thursday, when the institution is closed).

THE COUNTY PRISON (New North road) is a formidable-looking range of building, occupying a position which could with more propriety have been employed in embellishing that part of the city with handsome dwellings. It was rebuilt in 1853, on the site of the former Gaol and Bridewell, and now frowns on the chief promenade of the citizens—the Northernhay—a terror to evil-doers. Its capacities for lodgment are very great, as in addition to the offenders of the entire county, the city prisoners and the naval and military prisoners from Plymouth and Devonport find accommodation therein.

THE COUNTY POLICE STATION adjoins the Prison, and is a handsome, solid-looking structure. The head-quarters of the Devon County Constabulary was until 1873 located at a private dwelling-house in Paris-street, but the development of the constabulary business imperatively called for an establishment more suited to its requirements as the central office for the county, and hence the present erection. The new station comprises not only the offices necessary for the business of the force, but likewise affords accommodation for the staff and reserve, with necessary out-buildings, stabling, cells, &c.

THE CASTLE, in which all the county business is transacted, is a plain stone building erected within the walls of Rougemont Castle, founded by the Conqueror. It was built in the year 1773, and devoted to its present purposes of a County Hall. It contains suites of apartments for official and judicial uses, and in the Crown Court hangs a noble painting representing the "Judgment of Daniel." The courtyard is spacious, and is used as a parade-ground by the Volunteers; forming one of the entrances to Northernhay it is much traversed by pedestrians, and the old rampart or castle wall on the eastern side is much frequented in summer time, as affording a pleasant shady promenade, and commanding several fine views. In front of the Castle is a statue of Earl Fortescue, K.G., placed there in 1863.

VICTORIA HALL (Queen-street). This building was erected to accommodate the expected large gatherings consequent on the visit paid to the city in 1869 by the members of the British Association. It is capable of containing an assemblage of 2,500 persons, and is lofty and well lighted and ventilated. Being built with a view to immediate occupation, the exterior presents no features worthy of notice, but the addition of a new western wing during the present year (1874), indicates, from its superiority of design, that when completed the Hall will rank amongst the most imposing of our public buildings.

POST-OFFICE and Postal Telegraph Office (Queen-street). The business of this establishment was removed a few years ago from the former offices in the same street, and the present building is both lofty and commodious, comprising all branches of the departments under one roof.

THE MARKETS. The importance of Exeter as the market town of a rich agricultural district rendered the erection of suitable markets a matter of primary consideration, and an Act of Parliament for the purpose having been obtained, two

covered markets were built at a cost of nearly £90,000, which for spaciousness and the public accommodation they afford are not excelled. The Lower Market, situated in Fore-street, was opened in 1836, and contains the Corn Exchange, besides being used as a Saturday retail market, when it is well supplied with butchers' meat, fruit, vegetables, and other necessaries. The Higher Market fronts Queen-street, but has entrances from Goldsmith-street and Paul-street. It was opened in 1838, and occupies an area of 230 feet by 160 feet. On Tuesday and Friday the building is fully occupied by the dealers in country produce, and large quantities of these articles are disposed of to the retail dealers of the city. Meat, poultry, eggs, fish, &c., are abundantly supplied; and boots and shoes, with wearing apparel, are likewise largely displayed. The Fish Market occupies one corner of the building, and is open daily.

THE CATTLE MARKET is situated in the Bonhay road, and is open for the sale of Stock every Friday.

THE ROYAL PUBLIC ROOMS (New London Inn Square) were built by subscription in 1820, and devoted to the holding of balls, concerts, public meetings, and the like. The large room is 92 feet long by 41 feet in breadth, with a height of 40 feet.

THE THEATRE (at the junction of Bedford Circus with Southernhay) is a neat building, and possesses handsome and commodious internal arrangements.

WEST OF ENGLAND INSURANCE OFFICE (High-street) is a handsome stone edifice, with a fine statue of King Alfred over the front.

DEVON AND EXETER SAVINGS BANK (Corner of Bedford Circus) is a plain building, affording but little indication in its exterior of the weighty business transacted within its walls. It was established in 1815, and is empowered to grant Government Annuities.

DEVON AND EXETER INSTITUTION (Cathedral yard) is a literary institution of a very high order. The library contains over 12,000 volumes.

THE BARRACKS. Under the new military arrangements Exeter forms the centre of a district, and Artillery is the branch of the service allotted to it. The Higher Barracks is situated close behind the Gaol, and is occupied by a detachment of Field Artillery; the Lower Barracks, about a mile out on the Topsham road, being occupied by Royal Horse Artillery.

PUBLIC PARKS. The pleasures of a residence in Exeter are much enhanced by the possession of several charming spots dedicated to the recreation and enjoyment of the citizens. Foremost in this respect stands *Northernhay* an extensive piece of ground on the northern slopes of the old Castle, tastefully laid out with walks and well planted with ornamental and flowering shrubs; many fine elm trees are scattered over the grounds, and their umbrageous shelter forms an agreeable retreat during the heat of summer; one of the walks is thickly planted with flourishing lime trees, which, interlacing their branches overhead, present a mass of foliage almost impenetrable by the sun's rays. The most extensive and varied views are obtainable from the grounds, and the busy scene presented in witnessing the traffic on the London and South Western line of railway, in the valley immediately below, is a source of never-failing interest to promenaders. Seats are plentifully provided in all the walks. Two noble monuments to departed worth are placed in the most commanding situations the grounds offer: the first, a statue of the late Sir Thomas Dyke Acland, Bart., cut in white marble, and placed on a pedestal of granite, suitably inscribed, enclosed within a fence with revolving spikes; the second, a white marble statue of Mr. John Dinham, formerly a merchant of this city, and a man of the most unbounded philanthropy. The figure represents Mr. Dinham as seated, with the open Bible resting on his knees, whilst his eyes are directed towards the Free Cottages which his munificence was mainly instrumental in causing to be erected on the site erst

called California, now known as Mount Dinham. In a north-westerly direction from Northernhay is situated *Bury Meadow*, another public pleasure-ground (much frequented by the juvenile population) likewise nicely laid out with flowers, shrubs and some fine elm trees, with walks and numerous seats, and enclosing a spacious area of green sward. *The Bonhay* is a retired place by the waterside, within a few hundred yards of Exe Bridge, and adjoining the Cattle Market. Here, also, there are some fine trees, and the walks are provided with seats which look out on the quiet river scenery.

THE CEMETERY for the City of Exeter occupies a well-chosen site about half-a-mile out on the Bath road. Up to the year 1866 the city interments used to take place in the old Cemetery, in Bartholomew yard, but since the opening of the new ground in that year it ceased to be generally used, and but few burials now take place there. The new Cemetery comprised originally about 10 acres of ground; but an addition has since been made for the purpose of affording burial ground for the extensive parish of St. Leonard. The ground is apportioned out to the respective uses of members of the Church of England, Dissenters, and Roman Catholics. The two former bodies have each a mortuary Chapel within the walls.

RAILWAY STATIONS. These do not come immediately within the pale of notice as public buildings, but as their magnitude renders them very conspicuous features in the architecture of the city, a passing glance at them in succession may be permitted, as conveying at once description and situation. *St. David's*, the Exeter station of the Bristol and Exeter line, is situated at the western extremity of the city, adjoining Red Cow village. It is one of the prettiest buildings of the kind in the West of England, and both in this respect and as regards the extent of ground devoted to its uses, affords evidence of the flourishing state of the Company.—*St. Thomas's*, the station of the South Devon and Cornwall line, is situated in the parish of St. Thomas, within a couple hundred yards of Exe Bridge. It is considerably elevated, and is an extensive and commodious pile of building. The outer platforms command some fine views.—*Queen Street* station occupies the valley under Northernhay, and, although its primary application was for the traffic of the London and South Western line, it now commands that of the Exmouth branch and the North Devon line. The platform accommodation is extensive and commodious

BENEVOLENT AND CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS.

Few cities in the kingdom can boast a larger number of institutions devoted to benevolent and charitable purposes, and certainly in proportion to population none equal it; and when it is remembered that Exeter possesses no inherent vitality as a centre of trade or manufactures, the amount of money set apart for these uses contrasts very favorably with the corresponding efforts made in the same direction by the modern seats of wealth. The following summary of our local charities will amply bear out this assertion.

DEVON AND EXETER HOSPITAL (Southernhay) was founded in 1741, and being several times enlarged is now capable of receiving a very large number of patients. The exterior presents a frontage of considerable extent, and adjoining is a neatly built Chapel, erected for the use of the inmates in 1869. The Hospital is justly regarded as the noblest institution in the county; in addition to the house patients a very large out-door number is always on the books, and all enjoy the most skilful treatment the city can furnish.

THE DISPENSARY, situated in Queen-street (corner of Northernhay-street), is also an admirable institution, established in 1818. The present building was erected in 1840-41, at a cost of £2,400.

WEST OF ENGLAND EYE INFIRMARY (Magdalen-street) was founded in 1808, and has proved of incalculable benefit to sufferers from affections of that most delicate organ, the eye. The institution is supported by benefactions and contributions.

INSTITUTION FOR THE BLIND.—The West of England Institution for the Instruction and Employment of the Blind, is situated on St. David's hill, and is a charity of immense public importance. It was originally established in 1838, and the present commodious premises were erected and appropriated to its use in 1843. The pupils are instructed in various arts, such as making baskets, mats, hearth-rugs, brushes, knitting, &c.; music is also successfully cultivated amongst them, and rehearsals, to which the public are admitted, take place on Wednesday afternoons (excepting in the month of July).

INSTITUTION FOR THE DEAF AND DUMB.—The West of England Institution for the Education of Deaf and Dumb Children is situated on the Topsham road, a short distance beyond St. Leonard's Church. It was originally founded in 1826, and, being subsequently enlarged, is now capable of receiving over 100 pupils. These are divided into three classes, who pay respectively at the rates of 3s. per week, £20, and £50 per annum; the deficiency being supplied by private donations and subscriptions. The benefits of the Institution are extended to children of the counties of Devon, Cornwall, Dorset, and Somerset.

DEVON AND EXETER FEMALE PENITENTIARY (Holloway-street) was established in 1819, and in the following year it was removed to the present house. It is supported by donations and subscriptions, and the inmates also make up articles of childrens' clothing for sale.

THE EXETER HOME (Bartholomew yard) was established in 1862, for the purpose of affording immediate temporary shelter to fallen women who are truly desirous of changing their course of life. It has been instrumental in rescuing many from a career of vice and shame.

ST. MARTHA'S ORPHANAGE and Nursery (Summerland Crescent), was established in 1863, and is supported by voluntary contributions.

FEMALE REFUGE for Discharged Prisoners, and Girls' Reformatory School, is situated on Polsloe road, and was established in 1858. It is a solid looking building, enclosed within walls.

WONFORD HOUSE HOSPITAL FOR THE INSANE, is a magnificent building, situated within a mile of the city, in the parish of Heavitree. The origin of the Institution dates from 1801, when it was established at Bowhill House, in the parish of St. Thomas. Although partaking more of the character of a Home than an Asylum, and reckoning amongst its patients persons of affluence, whose friends can well afford to pay for the very superior accommodation and comforts it offers, the Institution has a charitable foundation, and the contributions and donations bestowed upon it, have rendered it available to many poor professional men and others of a similar social standing, at rates suited to their circumstances, and in some instances entirely free of charge. The foundation stone of the present building was laid in October, 1866, and in July, 1869, it was formally opened by Lord Devon, President for the year, and the patients transferred from the old house in the following month. The internal arrangements are in a style commensurate with the imposing exterior, and private suites of apartments can be obtained by patients who desire extra accommodation. Attached to the Institution are two consulting physicians, a consulting surgeon, resident medical superintendent, a chaplain, and lady superintendent. The cost of the building, furniture, and land has been about £40,000.

In addition to the foregoing, there are numerous minor Institutions of a charitable nature, which will be noticed in connection with the addresses of the managers and officials.

Lant's—Twelve Almshouses in Bartholomew-street, for twelve poor men and women, who receive 3s 6d per week, with coals and medical attendance.

Grendon's—Almshouses in Preston-street (Ten Cells) for poor women, who receive 6s per week, with coals and medical attendance.

Hurst's—Twelve Almshouses in Spiller-street, for twelve poor men, married or single, who receive 7s 6d and 6s per week respectively, with coals and medical attendance.

Palmer's—Four Almshouses in Magdalen-street, for four poor women, who receive 4s per week, with coals and medical attendance.

Ameredith's—Distribution of Flannel Petticoats.

Buckenham's—Distribution at Christmas of money to householders of the Parishes of St. Lawrence, St. Paul, Allhallows-on-the-Walls, and Holy Trinity.

Tuckfield's—Distribution of Bread at Christmas and at Easter; and at Christmas, of gowns to poor women.

Calwodeley's—Grants of money to Awliscombe School, &c.

John Martyn's—To bind Apprentices with a premium of £20.

White and Blundell's—Loans of Money at 2 per cent. to poor tradesmen.

N.B.—Many of the above stipends are augmented from Calwodeley's gift.

On a vacancy occurring, the Mayor and Aldermen usually send two names to Mr. Kennaway, who selects one. Each inmate receives 2s weekly. The Chaplain (Rev. G. H. O. Shield) performs Divine Service weekly, and receives £14 per annum.
