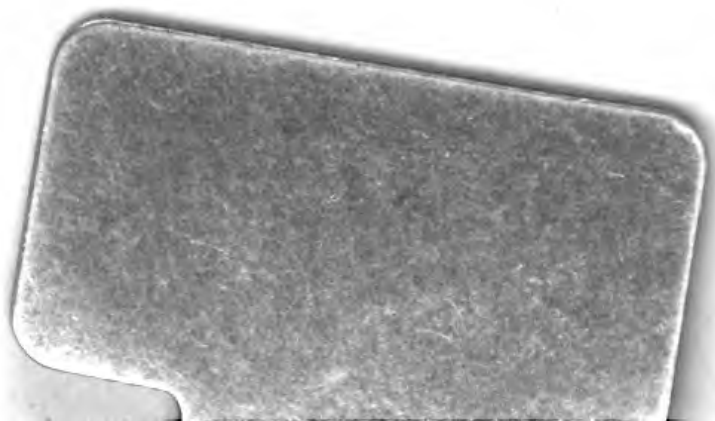

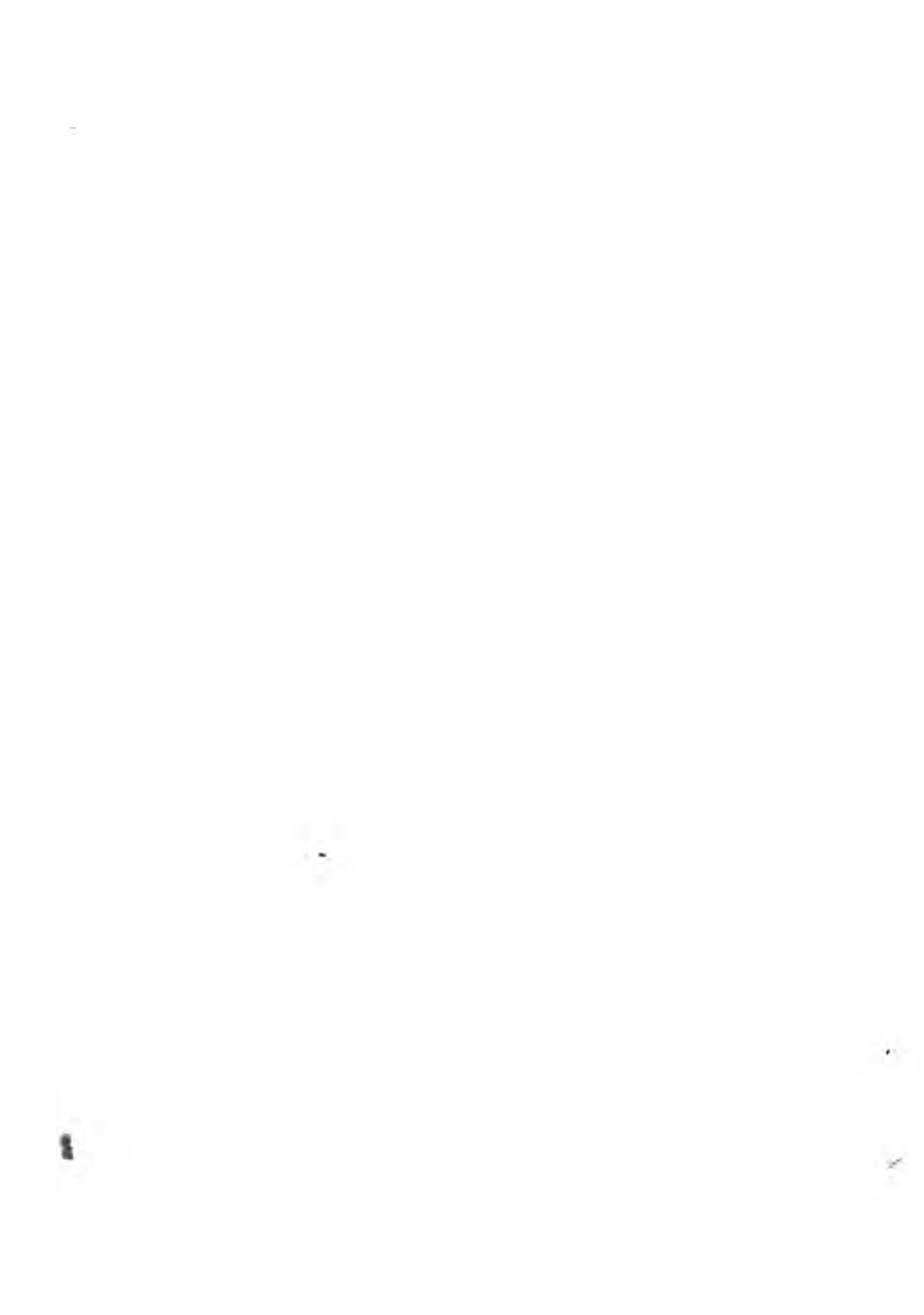

The income to be applied in the apprenticing so many boys of the poorest inhabitants of the parishes of St. Ebbe, St. Peter le-Bailey, St. Thomas, St. Mary Magdalen, and St. Giles, as the income will amount to for that purpose.—*Electors*—The Mayor, Aldermen, and Bailiffs.—The electors to see that they have proper masters, and in no instance to give it to a boy bound to his father.

Mr. Alderman Harris, 8l. For two poor freemen: one year to a freeman of the parish of St. Michael, and the other to a freeman of the Company of Tailors, of any parish in the city or suburbs. 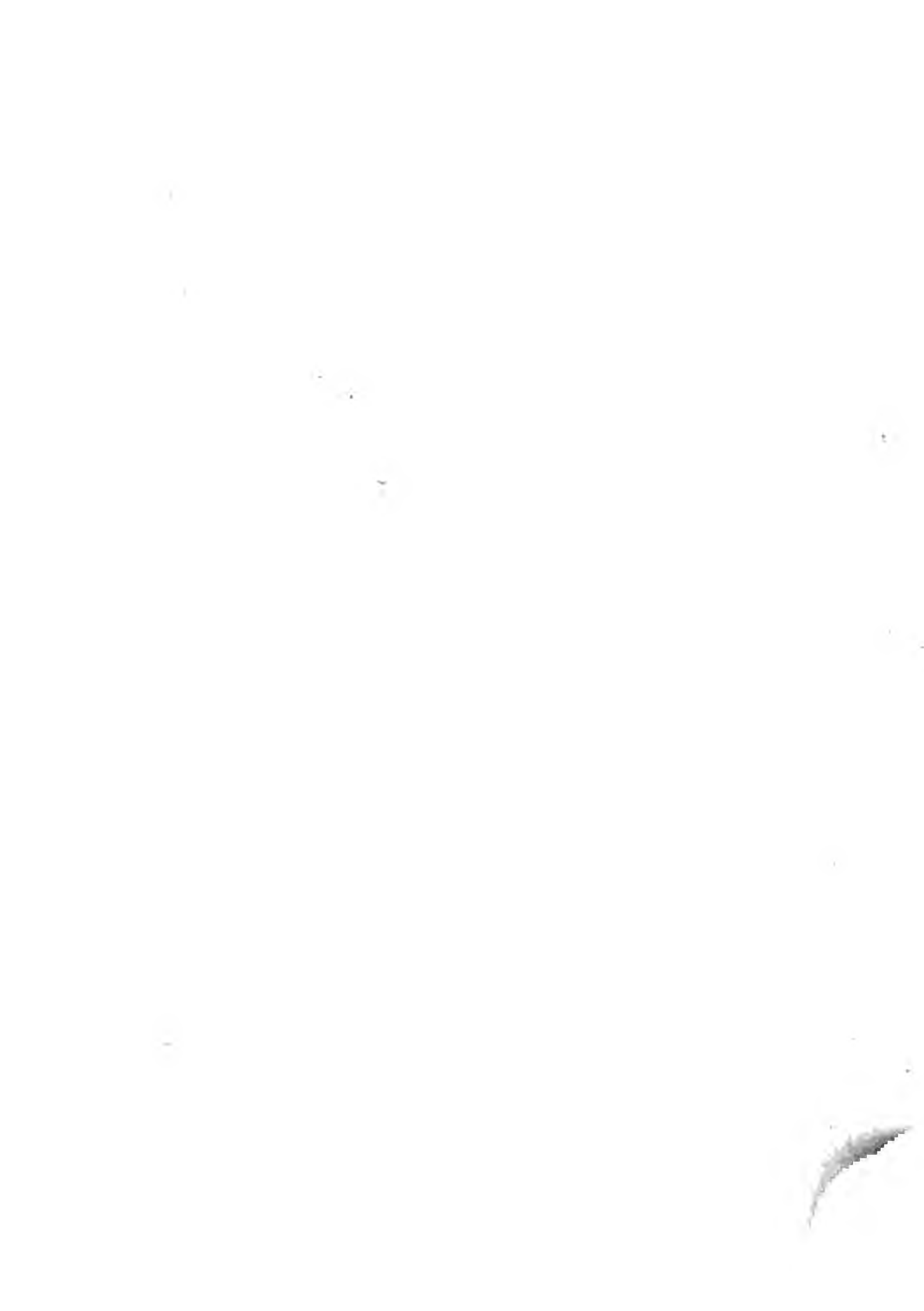

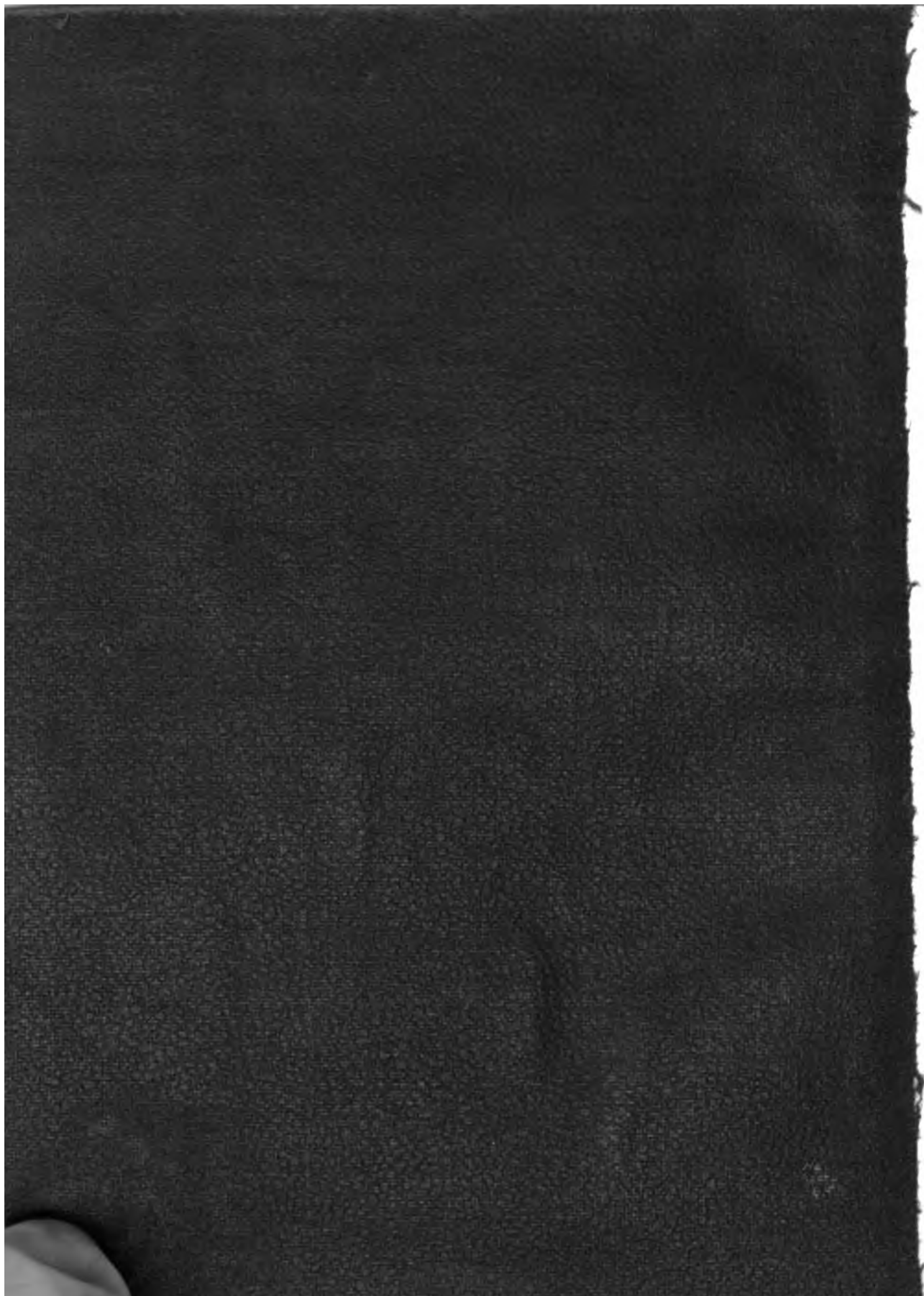
