BOURNEMOUTH.

BOURNEMOUTH, so called from being situated at the mouth of the Bourne—(not the one alluded to by Shakespeare, but a small stream of that name)—stretches at broken intervals for several miles along the Hampshire coast.

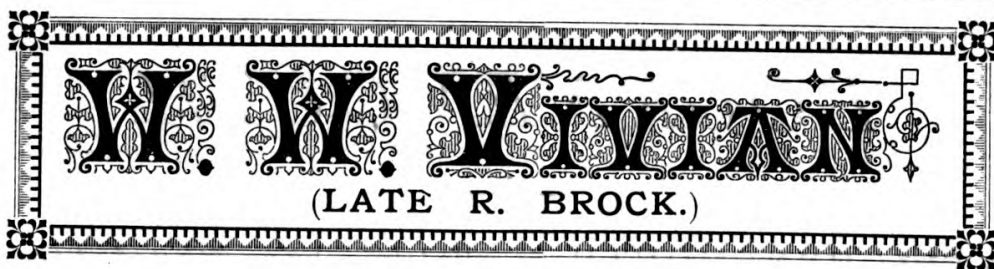
It differs essentially from, perhaps, any other town in England by reason of the peculiarity of the situation. Until quite recently, streets, save in the commercial parts, were unknown, the town being principally composed of delightfully situated villas, half hidden by the profusion of pine trees, so much so, that it is in a great measure concealed even from itself; each individual villa being almost as much secluded as if it were miles from any other habitation, and yet within easy distance, if not in actual command of beautiful and extensive perspective of sea and shore, of heathy moor and fertile valley, stretching its sinuous course inland, and up the slopes on either side fair villas rear their heads above the pine. Across the purple moorland detached blocks of noble buildings overlook the sea. Indeed, whatever the situation, sheltered or exposed, quiet or noisy, it may be found here. Building, however, progresses rapidly, so much so that in some parts the pines are fast disappearing before the inevitable bricks and mortar. Still, there remains many walks and drives, which to those who have an eye that delights in the beautiful, must be a never ending source of pleasure, save that they may lack that savage grandeur only met with in mountainous regions; but the scenery is diversified enough to suit the taste of the most fastidious.

There are walks on the breezy cliffs overlooking the sea, on the sandy beach, across the wild moorland radiant with the "bonnie red heather," so famous amongst our north country brethren. Walks in the shady glen, in the dark pine wood, and the green valley. All these are doubly interesting by reason of the marked contrast they bear to each other.

To particularise more especially on a few of the more notable features of the place we will select, first—

WESTOVER GARDENS.

This is one of the sweetest, cosiest, and most delicious places in all Bournemouth—an admirable conjunction of hill and dale luxuriantly draped with nature's choicest gems of sunny glade and limpid stream, of shady walks with seats placed in the most delightful nooks, of that bewitching quiet broken only by the songs of birds, the hum of insects and the distant murmur of the sea!

Here may the man of business wearied for the time with toil, tired of the noise and bustle of the city, or perplexed with the fluctuations of the stock market, find sweet respite from his many cares, forget hard cash, fling ledgers to the wind, and steal a march on time! And here, when soft winds play among the pines, pale invalids resort in search of what so many come to seek—good health.

It is through this one fact alone that Bournemouth has become so famous. Summer or winter the climate is beneficial to delicate constitutions. In the former there is always a cool breeze, in the latter it is sheltered alike from the rough sea-winds and the rude blasts from the north. Here also, when daylight fades and shadows play beneath the dark green foliage of the pines, fond lovers may be found ensconced in sweet sequestered nooks. To the visitor who is neither business man, invalid, or lover, we would merely say—go and see it for yourself, and seeing, enjoy.

THE CLIFFS.

This is the place for a “constitutional” as well as for a view that is at once varied and extensive. In Wordsworthian phraseology:—

“ Eastward in long perspective glittering shine
The wood-crowned cliffs that o'er the *sea* recline.”

The view seaward is very fine. The bay, and far as the eye can reach is in fine weather studded o'er with tiny craft and specks of distant sail. “The Needles” also in clear weather are distinctly visible. Around the coast the water is remarkably clear and free from weed, and, consequently, free from the strong smell of rotting marine vegetation such as at Weymouth and many other parts of the coast, and which so many sniff from a mile inland hugging themselves with the idea that they are being benefited by the “salt water.”

Westward the Island of Purbeck, noted for its marble quarries—is only a few miles distant, with “Old Harry,” a rock somewhat resembling the turret of an old castle, keeping watch over its southern point.

Up those same cliffs there are vague rumours concerning bold smugglers who in times gone by, by the aid of rope ladders, have eluded the vigilance of the coastguardsmen. But descending from our elevated position let us seek

THE BEACH.

From the pier westward the beach runs in a tolerably straight line for three or four miles, and when there is an even swell on the surface of the bay and a tolerably stiff breeze, a breaker several miles in length may be seen slowly rising along the edge of the shore, the white foam curling over its ridge, and then the whole mass falling, dissolving with a tremendous crash that sounds like the report of a cannon from the top of the cliffs.

“ League long rollers thundering on the shore.”

Generally, however, it is very smooth along this coast so that there is little or no inconvenience experienced from flying spray, unless the weather is very boisterous. The sand, when moist, which it always is in winter and near the water's edge in summer, as the tide ebbs and flows but a few feet, makes a beautifully even and firm walk, the principal view consisting of the high and rugged cliffs on the one hand and the heaving ocean on the other.

THE CHINES.

Tortured by the storms of centuries the cliffs have given way at places, and slipped back and back until they form a gradient from the beach to the heights above, of which advantage has been taken in several instances to form roadways and footpaths to the Poole Road and elsewhere. The names of the principal gaps are:—Durley Chine, Alum Chine, Branksome Chine and Herbert Home Chine. The sides of some of these are covered over with bramble, furze and heath, with here and there a stunted pine; others are bold and naked, full of miniature chasms and precipices, recalling Wordsworth's lines:—

“ Pleasant to him who on the soft, cool moss,
Extends his careless limbs along the front
Of some huge cave, whose rocky ceiling casts,
A twilight of its own, an ample shade;
Where the wren warbles; while the dreaming man
Half-conscious of the soothing melody,
With sidelong eye, looks out upon the scene,
By that impending covert made more soft,
More low and distant.”

THE PIER.

“ Here will we sit and let the sounds of music
Creep in our ears; soft stillness and the night
Become the touches of sweet harmony.”

Nothing is much more enjoyable when the moon begins to dimple on the rippling waves on a summer evening, and the band discourses “sweet music,” than a seat or promenade on the pier, the great resort of all the beauty and fashion of Bournemouth. Everyone goes to the pier, the pleasure boats call there for their light-hearted freight of excursionists. Visitors go there for pleasure or for benefit as the case may be, assistants in business houses go there, and to them it must be a benefit as well as a pleasure. Heavy swells have been seen there, but some of them have cost Bournemouth so much hard cash they have become very unwelcome visitors.

THE VALLEY.

“ And inlande from ye shore for miles three or moe,
Ane vallē runnes through whilk a bourne doth y-flowe,
On ilkē side ye pine cladde hilles tower,
Ye valle eke blumes faire yt soote flower.”

The above is literally correct albeit the spelling is somewhat antiquated. The flowers, however, at that distant date were doubtless wild varieties; whereas, now, for about one mile inland on

either side of the stream the valley is laid out into pleasure gardens. The opposite height viewed from between the Arcade and the Bridge bears a striking resemblance to Edinburgh Castle from the Grassmarket.

Bournemouth is sadly destitute of history,

“ No lonely turret shattered and outworn,
Stands venerably proud, too proud to mourn
Its long lost grandeur,”

on any of the pine-clad heights. It is, in fact, a modern town. Where history is silent, however, legendary lore often supplies its place. What for instance could have an air of greater reality than the following verses :

“ There’s a sound in the hamlet by night,
There are maidens in tears by the shore ;
There are boats in the surf, and far out in the bay,
And anxious-faced men at the oar :
But the drear night winds sigh o’er the billowy waste,
And leal hearts are bursting with pain ;
'Neath the deep blue wave in a cold, cold grave,
There are lips that will ne'er smile again.
Sing low for her lover, sing low—
A tear for the heart that is torn,
From her last long sleep in the surging deep,
Fair Helen will never return.

The boatie was seen from the shore,
When wavelets were dancing in light,
And the wee sail was filled with the soft sea winds,
As they blew on that autumn night.
But the moon hid her face in a dark fleeting cloud,
And a murmur was borne through the air ;
When the cloud pass'd away and light fell on the bay,
No more was the wee boatie there.

Incidents like these often keep pace with history. But those interested in the weird associations attached to “ old forgotten far off things and fights fought long ago,” will find spots congenial to their minds in the immediate neighbourhood. Let them read of

the murder of Rufus in the New Forest, or of Edward the Martyr at Corfe Castle, and then—

“ Weigh against a grain of sand, the glories of a throne.”

OBJECTS OF INTEREST.

Bournemouth abounds in many places of interest. Of the churches, St. Peter's is the mother church. It was erected in 1845 by Sir George Gervis, Bart., and consecrated by the Bishop of Winchester, on August 7th, 1845, and on the appointment of the first incumbent, the Rev. A. M. Bennett, it was at that time a church of very inferior design, was endowed with a rent-charge of £50 per year, and would only accommodate about 275 worshippers; but time, energy, and money have wrought a wonderful change, and the old-fashioned church is now transformed into a magnificent structure. It is of Early English or Gothic style of architecture. The material is chiefly Purbeck stone with Bath stone dressings combined with red sandstone, while the interior glows in its polished marble and alabaster. The entire arrangements are very elaborate throughout, a noticeable feature in the design is the comparative plainness and simplicity of the nave, when contrasted with the extraordinary architectural richness of the choir and sanctuary. The various subjects introduced into the different windows are well worthy of strict attention. The south aisle, which was added in 1850, is lighted by windows of two lights, having quarterfoils in the heads. The north aisle, added in 1854, is lighted by twelve broad trefoil-headed lancet windows, all connected by a continuous shafted internal arcading. The chancel is of four bays, and opens into the nave by a lofty and broad arch, with corbelled imposts having marble shafts. At the west end of the church is a tower, 72 feet in height, surmounted by a noble spire which rises about 120 feet from the ground.

Holy Trinity Church, like St. Peter's, has wonderfully changed from its originality. In the autumn of 1867, a substantial building was erected and opened for public worship on Advent Sunday, on the 2nd of July in the following year, the corner stone of the present church was laid. It is built entirely of brick, externally of deep red, internally of white.

Then we also have St. Michael's, St. Clement's, St. Stephen's, the Roman Catholic Church, and the various Dissenting places of worship, particulars of which may be found on page 26 and following pages.

Bournemouth also boasts of a Theatre, neat and cosy, but an unpaying speculation, we should think, to its owners. Then there is a Town Hall, large and commodious, and very centrally situated, an attractive Arcade, where at times may be seen the fashion and beauty of Bournemouth. A Government School of Art, near the Post Office. A Gallery of Fine Arts, situated between St. Peter's and Holy Trinity Churches, which is open daily, and contains a large and very interesting collection of over 5,000 engravings, etchings, woodcuts, &c., by old and modern masters. An hour can be most pleasantly spent here.

There are also many good Hotels and Boarding Establishments, as well as Furnished Apartments. As to the Schools, Newspapers, Libraries, Postal Information, &c., we refer the reader to the Local Information to be found further on.

Bathing in the open sea is amply provided for. The most convenient and popular place is near the pier.

Yachting and Boating is much indulged in, as the pier offers every advantage for embarking and landing from boats, yachts, &c., with safety.

Good Fishing may be found in the Bay, but without the guidance of one of our numerous and experienced boatmen and fishermen, the angler would find sport dull and the returns "few and far between."

EXCURSIONS.

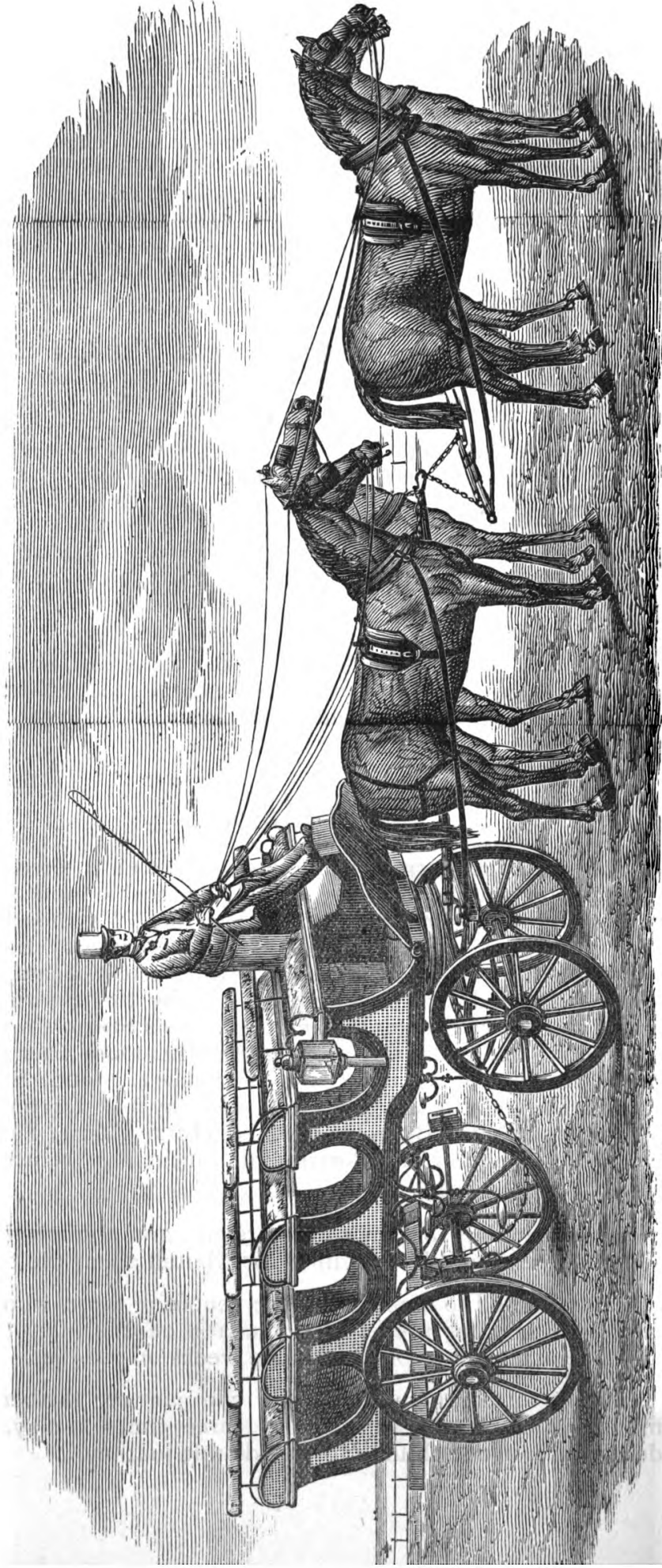
Lovers of trips on the "briny deep" are well catered for, and abundant opportunity is afforded for agreeable and pleasant excursions by the Bournemouth, Swanage and Weymouth Steam Packet Compy's (Cozens & Co.) magnificent steamers "Empress," "Premier" or "Queen," which are the fastest boats on the station, and noted for punctuality; and by the Bournemouth, Swanage and Poole Steam Packet Company's Steam-ship "Lord Elgin," which make daily trips from Bournemouth Pier to some place of interest along the coast. Branksea Island, Swanage, Lulworth, Weymouth and Portland, Torquay and Dartmouth on the west; and Alum Bay, Freshwater, Hurst Castle, Yarmouth, Ryde, Cowes, Ventnor and Portsmouth, on the east returning the same day.

Full particulars of these Excursions are published in the local newspapers, and by handbills distributed about the town.

It may be well to mention for the benefit of those who cannot "stand" the sea, but prefer a promenade on the pier, that the bands have arranged to play alternate weeks on the pier.

Visitors to Southbourne-on-Sea can journey thither by an omnibus, which leaves the Square three times a day, at the moderate fare of one shilling for the double journey.

Trips by land are provided by the comfortable and popular "Char-à-banc." In the summer season trips are made daily to one of the following places, viz ;—Rufus' Stone, Lyndhurst, Boldre Wood, &c., in the New Forest, The Shakers' Encampment at Hordle, and Christchurch, on the east. Corfe Castle, Wimborne, Canford, &c., on the west. Sometimes the applications for seats have been so numerous that it has been necessary to run several vehicles.

Laidlaw's town omnibus is a very great convenience to persons going from one part of the town to another, running from the Queen's Road to the East Station, and as far as the Coffee Tavern, near Bourne Valley Pottery. The omnibus is well patronised.

SUBURBS.

Westbourne—About half-a-mile along the Poole Road. A rapidly increasing suburb of Bournemouth ; a short distance farther on we come to Branksome Park, a large estate now laid out for building purposes, a number of handsome residences are already erected, and many others are in course of erection.

Branksome Glen—Is picturesquely situated in the Branksome Woods towards the sea. This is one of the most romantic spots around Bournemouth, and a visit to the mirror lake will be much appreciated by lovers of the beautiful in nature.

Bourne Valley—To the westward about a-mile-and-half, is another offspring of Bournemouth. It boasts of a large Pottery, and the Gas and Water Company's Works are also situated in this valley.

Talbot Village—Is an interesting place about one-and-a-half miles to the north-west of Bournemouth. This village was built at the sole expense of Miss Talbot,—whose name it bears. There are five farms and about 20 ornamental cottages for the working classes, with an acre of ground attached to each. The school accommodates 120 children. The church is in the Early Decorated style, and was erected, furnished, and endowed by Miss Georgina Talbot, at a cost of £5,000.

Winton—Is situated about one-and-half miles to the north of Bournemouth, and may be termed a mechanical village, that is to say, its inhabitants are chiefly mechanics employed in and around Bournemouth. The situation is healthy and picturesque. A large quantity of milk, butter, and eggs of excellent quality are brought into Bournemouth from the Winton and Talbot village country. Winton is therefore a very important suburb, and on the other hand Bournemouth is a very excellent customer to Winton and the surrounding dairy country.

Boscombe—Is fast following in the enterprising footsteps of Bournemouth, and those who have occasion to pass through what a few years ago was only a scattered village, remark upon its rapid growth ; it is a pity, however, that the owner

of the "Spa" property has let such a valuable acquisition as the Mineral Spring go to ruin. As Dr. Arthur Hill Hassall says, "the water is of great purity, of agreeable flavor and a natural Seltzer."

Pokesdown—About three miles to the eastward, is fast progressing from a small roadside village into a busy and flourishing town.

Southbourne-on-Sea.—A small but rapidly rising suburb of Bournemouth, three miles distant from "The Square," possesses a remarkably cool, pure, bracing air in summer, a mild, dry climate with plenty of sunshine in winter, a gravel and sand subsoil and the great advantage of having a pretty river for boating within a few minutes' walk. The water and gas supplies are the excellent ones from the mains of the Bournemouth Company. The sea-bathing is good, machines and boxes being provided. Southbourne, although only boasting of a few years' existence, has a first-class hotel (The South Cliff), with Billiards and Reading Rooms, which is much patronised by private families and is highly spoken of for its comfort, cuisine and moderate charges. The Winter Garden is also a great attraction; although ugly in its exterior appearance, the interior is always charming and gay with its hanging baskets of beautiful flowers. Mr. W. Bailey is the excellent manager. Admission, sixpence each. The first part of the Church of St. Catherine—which, when completed, will be a handsome structure—has been erected by local effort at a cost of about £3,500 and has accommodation for 300 worshippers. The Rev. G. Webster is the resident officiating clergyman. The post and telegraph offices are centrally placed near the church and there are two postal deliveries daily. Omnibuses run three times daily to Bournemouth and also to Christchurch Station, which is now, by the opening of Tuckton Bridge, only one mile distant. Southbourne-on-Sea, which owes its origin to a local physician—has lately passed into the hands of the Southbourne-on-Sea Freehold Land Company, Limited. This Company—which has, we understand, already disposed of building sites to the extent of £14,000 in a few months' existence—proposes to add to the present attractions of the place by building an esplanade, affording sites for houses on the Under Cliff and thus securing the benefit of a winter warmth, not yet made available in any part of the Bournemouth Bay. Tenders for part of this esplanade are, we see, being advertised for in the Local and Engineering papers, as we are going to press. It is probable that a pier will shortly follow.

Tuckton Bridge—which was only opened for traffic in May, 1884, has proved, as was expected, the greatest convenience to the neighbouring locality, the distance from Southbourne-on-Sea to Christchurch Station being now reduced from three miles to one mile. Two very pretty additional driving routes on the south side of the river Stour are also available for Bournemouth visitors

proceeding to Christchurch. Boating facilities being also provided in connection with a stage on the north side of the Tuckton Bridge, Bournemouth people travelling by train to Christchurch for the purpose of enjoying a row on the river Stour have only half-a-mile to walk, instead of having to go to Wick Ferry. Mr. Miller is the proprietor of the boats at both places. The bridge, a somewhat lengthy one, is substantially built of iron piles with a wooden superstructure, and was erected under a special Act of Parliament by a local Company, at a total cost of about £4,000. Although the tolls are very moderate ($\frac{1}{2}$ d. for foot-passengers, 1d. for horses, $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. for horses drawing two wheel carriages, &c., &c.) the traffic already obtained is, we are glad to hear, sufficient to secure the financial success of this undertaking, which is an enormous boon to the inhabitants of Southbourne and Christchurch, as well as a convenience to Bournemouth visitors.

CHRISTCHURCH.

CHRISTCHURCH is situated in the south-western extremity of Hampshire, about 5 miles from Bournemouth, 100 miles from London, and 24 miles from Southampton. It is a Parliamentary Borough, railway station, parish, hundred and union, and is just northward of the confluence of the two rivers, Avon and Stour. The town is of great antiquity, and is referred to in the Domesday Book as THUINAM, a Royal Manor and Burgh, containing 31 houses. In ancient days it was called TWYNEHAM BOURNE, from its situation between the two rivers. The venerable Priory Church is supposed to be of Roman origin, and the earliest historical notice of it occurs in the Saxon Chronicles, which record its occupation by Ethelwold during his revolt against his kinsman Edward the Elder; then again, we read that it was founded in Edward the Confessor's reign. The site chosen is supposed to have been one where a Pagan temple formerly stood, various evidences to support this belief have been discovered. The legend states that the foundations of the building were first laid on St. Catherine's Hill—the site of an old Roman encampment overlooking the town,—but that “every night the walls were thrown down and the stones removed to the little promontory at the meeting of the waters of the Avon and Stour, which gave name to the town, Twyneham-bourne,—the dwelling by the two streams. Unable to disobey the command implied, the builders commenced their work anew on the present site, and daily a stranger came and toiled; never was he seen to eat, and never did he appear at the payment of wages. When one of the rafters was too short he lengthened it by simply drawing out its end, as if the timber was an elastic material,

and the 'miraculous beam' was long shown to visitors; and when the church was to be consecrated he was nowhere to be seen, but the monks significantly dedicated it to the name of Christ."

The church is situated at the southern portion of the town. The beauty of its construction presents many fine examples of Norman and Early English architecture. Amongst the many monuments in this notable building will be seen a fine marble cenotaph to the memory of the poet Shelley; a handsomely carved monument to the Viscountess Fitzharris (mother of the present Lord Malmesbury), and a beautiful Chantry in Caen stone to the memory of Margaret, Countess of Salisbury.

At the back of the altar there are the remains of a very magnificent reredos, representing the tree of the genealogy of Our Lord. There is also a very fine rood screen (restored in 1848.) The carving on the choir stalls is well worthy of notice: some are of a very quaint character, most of them with a satirical or political meaning.

In the churchyard some very peculiar epitaphs are to be found, and from this spot a view can be obtained of the remains of the Castle and Baronial Hall of the De Redvers family.

Visitors will also observe the fine old Norman bridge over the Avon.

The Congregational Church is a neat and commodious building capable of seating about 700 persons, was built by the late Mr. Walden, and cost £4,000.

The Roman Catholic Church is also a very substantial building.

The Wesleyans and Baptists have also places of worship here.

The town has many good shops, and with its wide, clean streets may be taken as a fair specimen of a quiet country town.

The river Avon is justly celebrated for its yield of fine salmon, connoisseurs declare it to be the finest flavored "red fish" procurable in the Kingdom.

A very strange phenomena of nature and one not generally known, is that the Avon is the only river in the kingdom,—and we believe the only one in the world—that during the freezing months of the year, has the uncommon peculiarity of freezing at the bottom, and rising to the top in soft, marshy masses, in very severe weather often blockading the river and causing some inconvenience.

Of the local charities there are a great many, some of them very useful. One provides for the apprenticeship of poor lads and girls to any trade, paying a premium to the master. Another provides for the gift of a loaf of bread to each poor person applying for it; another to the distribution of a certain number of coats to poor men once a year; another for a number of shillings to be distributed on New Year's Day; and others for pensions and gifts of various kinds.

There are many beautiful walks and drives about Christchurch. During the months of May and June, no more delightful outing could be taken than a drive or a walk to the rhododendron forest at Heron Court the seat of The Earl of Malmesbury. The view from the top of the hill, looking down on the mass of flower and foliage is exquisite and must be seen to be appreciated, and when once seen the effect can never be forgotten.

Since the enclosure of the common in Portfield, a large recreation ground has been formed, and a good cricket ground laid out. Bicycle, Cricket, Football, Fire Brigade and Rowing Clubs are all in a flourishing state of health; the Working Men's Institute Reading Room is in the Town Hall Building. There are also Liberal and Conservative Clubs, both well supported, and everything in general denotes that although the town is of ancient origin, the community is an enlightened one.

THE NEW FOREST.

THE NEW FOREST,

Embracing Lyndhurst, Brockenhurst, Minstead and Ringwood, together with a sketch of Lymington and Hurst Castle.

PLEASURE seekers who are unacquainted with the New Forest, have yet to visit one of the loveliest and most charming retreats to be found in the kingdom. Whether William the Conqueror was despotic and cruel in creating the Forest or not, one thing is certain, that he conferred a great and last benefit upon posterity; not to the third and fourth generations only, but down to one still existing and flourishing hundreds of years after that monarch had passed away.

This charming district is nearly 60 miles in circumference, or about the size of the Isle of Wight, and contains 66,300 acres; of these, 900 acres are encroachments; 11,200 acres enclosures round the keepers' lodges; 25,000 acres belong to manors and freehold estates, independent of forest laws; and about 1000 acres are held of the Crown by leases. The remainder consists of woods and about 14,000 acres of pasture lands. As computed by Cobbett, its original extent was 144,000 acres. However, there is still enough left and to spare of forest, enough of sylvan beauty—wild and grand. The whole is under the control of a Lord Warden, but the administration has recently been greatly simplified and brought more directly under Parliamentary control. Oak and beech are here extensively grown for the supply of Her Majesty's dockyards.

The present denizens of the Forest are—badgers, but not in great numbers; foxes, which thrive here wonderfully; a complete "populace" of squirrels; rabbits; the famous Hampshire hogs; the red deer; and the small, hardy, New Forest ponies, resembling in many points the ponies of Shetland and the Hebrides.

The scenery of the New Forest is richest, perhaps, between Minstead and Ringwood, though the vistas of gleaming waters opened up through the branching trees in the vicinity of Beaulieu may better commend themselves to the taste of many. There are "nooks of greenery" in several parts so wild, so savage, so venerable in character, that the wayfarer almost expects to hear the ringing blast of the huntsman's horn echo through the silent glades, and the whirring arrow shoot through the hissing air, and the swift stag spring far away into the deep, dark,

shadowy copse. Tradition has not yet abandoned this haunted ground. The meddling Wood-imp, the colt-pixy, still leads astray the wandering horse, "neighing in likeness of a filly foal." Bees are told over in the hive when the corpse lies pale and rigid in the house. The Christmas mummers repeat in the forest-villages the old mystery of "St. George and the Dragon." Fairies at midnight tread a merry measure on the sward, where, next morning, you may easily trace the prints of their tripping feet. The curling smoke of a gipsy encampment may still be looked for among the wooded depths.

There are now but few "squatters" in the Forest, and the poachers have almost disappeared. Over purple heaths, and through avenues of beech, and fir, and birch, and up fresh grassy knolls, and down into pleasant valleys where the water-nymphs are ever-singing, the pilgrim may wander unheeded and undisturbed.

Minstead has in itself no special feature, except a quaint old church. The principal inn here bears the sign of "The Trusty Servant," a curious compound of an ass, a deer, a hog, and a man.

Brockenhurst is now a favourite centre for tourists through the Forest. This is a picturesque village, half hidden by foliage, situated near the railway station; and close to Brockenhurst Park. On an artificial mound, stands the church with its Saxon nave and Early English chancel; its curious chancel arch; an enriched Norman door on its south side; and a Norman font of Purbeck marble. The churchyard rejoices in a venerable ivy-shrouded oak, about 23 feet in girth, and a noble yew tree whose hollow trunk is 17 feet in circumference. The principal hotel is the Rose and Crown, Mr. James Ings, proprietor, where hunters, hacks, horses and carriages can be obtained.

Lyndhurst is a large and important village about two miles from the railway station. Its only curiosity is the "Queen's House," a homely structure of the time of Charles II. The hall is decorated with some stags' heads and "William Rufus' stirrup-iron," the latter, traditionally reported to have been made use of by the doomed king in his last fatal chase. There are numerous mansions in this neighbourhood, and the parks are luxuriantly wooded. The principal hotels are the Crown which now provides additional omnibus accommodation, making eight journeys daily from Lyndhurst Road Station to Lyndhurst, a very great convenience to tourists and others visiting this part of the Forest; and the Fox and Hounds, where hunters and hacks are kept for hunting the red deer. The committee of the New Forest Deer Hounds have received from the Commissioners of Wood and Forests the details of the terms under which permission has been given for Deer-hunting in the Forest, viz.:—For about six weeks in August and September (bucks); during November and December (does); and during March and April (bucks). This permission is given on the express condition that the Deer-hunting shall be so arranged as not to injure or interfere with Fox-hunting.

From this point we will now visit Rufus' Stone, where a monument indicates the site of the fatal tree within whose shadow the second of the Norman Kings of England met his death. It is cased with iron and bears the following inscription:—"Here stood the oak tree, on which an arrow, shot by Sir Walter Tyrell at a stag, glanced, and struck King William II. (surnamed Rufus) in the breast, of which he instantly died on the 2d day of August, anno 1100." William Howitt, the poet, wrote thus of the New Forest scenery: "Delighted with the true woodland wildness and solemnity of beauty, I roved onward through the wildest woods that came in my way. Awaking as from a dream, I saw far around me one deep shadow, one thick and continuous roof of boughs, and thousands of hoary boles, standing clothed as it were with the very spirit of silence. I admired the magnificent sweep of some grand old trees as they hung into a glade or ravine, some delicious opening in the deep woods, or the grotesque of particular trees, which seemed to have been blasted into blackness, and contorted into inimitable crookedness, by the savage genius of the place." Some of the principal trees of the Forest are known by their names: such as the Knyghtwood Oak, the King Oak, the Queen Oak, the Queen Bower Oak, the Twelve Apostles, and St. Peter's Oak. Of the Twelve Apostles, seven have departed this earthly sphere. The Knyghtwood Oak was a grand and gigantic fellow, standing like a king far above his fellows.

Lymington dates back from the early British Period, when its salterns supplied salt to the Phœnician traders. It may be inferred that it was afterwards a Roman station from the number of Roman coins and relics discovered here. Buck-

land Rings is an early British camp one mile to the northward. The town is pleasantly situated on a slope which descends to the river, at the point where the Boldre begins to widen into the Solent. It consists in the main of one long steep and picturesque street. The church is a large structure and dedicated to Thomas à Becket. There are good wharves on the river bank and ship building yards of some renown in the yachting world. There is good accommodation at the "Red Lion," High street.

Boldre Wood is a very charming locality and a favourite spot for pic-nic parties. Beyond Boldre, the broad brown heath spreads towards Brockenhurst in wild and romantic beauty.

South-west of Lymington, distant about six miles, stands **Hurst Castle**, and its two red light houses. The castle was built in 1535. It is the key to the narrow channel between the Hampshire coast and the Isle of Wight. It became a place of some importance in the wars between Charles I. and the Parliament, and was sized by the Parliamentary troops, when Charles was removed from Carisbrooke Castle and lodged in the above fortification.

Ringwood is a quiet, primitive little town, consisting principally of one long straggling street, and is situated in the delightful valley of the Avon. If the tourist be a disciple of Izaak Walton, he may spend some pleasant hours on the banks of the Avon. Salmon, trout, perch, and pike abound here. The trade of the town is chiefly in making the "real Ringwood knit" gloves, and collars and cuffs. The church is in the Early English style, but does not call for any special mention. The principal hotel is the White Hart.

SWANAGE.

SWANAGE is one of those quaint, old-fashioned little villages nestling quietly within a beautifully shaded valley, and so hid away from the busy world, that it is a place not very widely known to the outside world—although within a few miles of one of our most fashionable of watering places, Bournemouth. Years ago there was a swanery here—hence the name of Swan Village, modernised into Swanage. Its three sides are bounded by the sea, and a small stream on the fourth side completes its claim to an island.

It is one of the most retired summer resorts to be found for many miles along the coast. It is a seaport, distant about 7 miles (via sea) from Bournemouth; 15 miles from the Isle of Wight; 11 miles from Wareham, is in the County of Dorset, and is situated on the southern coast of the Isle of Purbeck. It is landlocked from high and furious winds by a noble mountainous range which slopes down to the water's edge over green downs, quarried, like some gigantic rabbit barrow, with the working of some 700 years. Unlike Bournemouth, it boasts of huge elm trees which flourish on the sea-beach and offer rest and shelter to the tired and exhausted pleasure seeker.

Its principal trade is stone, known as the Purbeck marble, which is shipped off to all parts of the country. This stone was

employed in the building of St. Paul's Cathedral and Salisbury and Winchester Cathedrals. The geologist may, by careful search of the numerous quarries, find rare and interesting fossils of reptiles, plants, shells, fish, &c. Straw Plaiting is an interesting and unique trade which is carried on to some extent.

THE WATER is pure and good, resembling the quality of the Burton-on-Trent water. SEA-BATHING is unusually good and forms one of the chief attractions of the place. The BEACH, which has a semi-circular appearance, not unlike the Bay of Naples, is free from pebbles and is perfectly safe. FISHING is very little indulged in except for crabs or lobsters.

Many OBJECTS OF INTEREST present themselves to the visitor. THE OLD CLOCK TOWER, which is erected near the pier, once stood on the Surrey side of London Bridge. THE MOWLEM INSTITUTE is situated on the beach, and erected at a cost of £1,300, was presented to the town by J. Mowlem, Esq. THE PILLAR which stands near the above Institute, commemorates a battle fought with the Danes in the Bay in 877. THE OBELISK, standing at the entrance of the town, was erected to the memory of Albert the Good by the loyal inhabitants of Swanage. THE CHURCH is dedicated to St. Mary, and was rebuilt (with the exception of the tower) in 1860. The tower is very ancient and interesting, it contains four bells and is about 80 feet in height, and supposed to have been built by the Saxons. Near the church is a COTTAGE, upon which may be seen a tablet bearing an inscription, commemorating the visit of John Wesley, in 1787. At White Cliff Farm, a walk of about 30 minutes, may be seen what is supposed to have been the RESIDENCE OF KING JOHN. AT GODLINGSTONE, about two miles, a very ancient ruin of "ye olde timee Monestry" is also seen.

Every accommodation for tourists, &c., is provided. The hotels and apartments are plentiful. Public and private conveyances meet every steamer, which convey passengers at moderate charges to almost any part of this notable Island.

THE OBJECTS OF INTEREST IN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD are, Old Harry Rocks, Parson's Barn Cave, Durlston Head, Dancing Ledge, &c. It will well repay the excursionist to visit also, Tilly Whim, an ancient quarry, two miles south; Studland—a most picturesque village, thickly wooded, three miles; "The Agglestone," or Holy Stone, a druidical altar, four miles; St. Alban's Head, where still stands an old Norman Chapel, six miles; Kimmeridge, nine miles, of great interest to the antiquarian, its ancient manufacture was turnery, the material being used for making ornaments such are armlets, anklets. Only a short time ago specimens were found highly polished and of very skilled workmanship.

SWANAGE QUIETUDE is, however, to be disturbed. They are to have a railway; work has commenced and in two years' time we may expect to see Swanage fast following in the footsteps of enterprising Bournemouth. The gentle peacefulness will be disturbed, and quaint little Swanage, with all its pleasurable quietness, will

give way to the bustle of the "Steam Hoss." There is no doubt the railway is much needed, and we can only hope to see in time Swanage what Bournemouth is now. The atmosphere is very bracing and in fact it would be difficult to find a more pleasant spot for general summer recreation than Swanage-by-the-Sea.

Corfe Castle and Wareham.

CORFE CASTLE is about five miles from Swanage in the Isle of Purbeck, and said to have been built by King Edgar about the year 965. The Castle is also about five miles from Wareham, at which place a few hours may be spent with advantage. Wareham is one of those "old ancient towns" which still possess a great deal of interest. The chief features are the ramparts or ancient walls, supposed to have been erected by the Danes, about the year 876. Corfe Castle is specially noted as having been the scene of the foul murder of Edward, King of the West Saxons, by the treachery of his mother-in-law, Elfrida. The story may be briefly related to the effect that Edward, who was hunting in the neighbourhood, resolved to pay a visit to his brother, who lived near. Having lost his attendants, Elfrida quickly thought it a fine opportunity to carry out her wicked purpose, she invited him to alight, but as he refused, she called for wine, and as he was in act of drinking, cavalier like, to the health of his mother-in-law, one of her attendants treacherously stabbed him. Finding himself wounded he rode away, but fainting from loss of blood, fell from his horse, and his foot became entangled in the stirrup, he was dragged a considerable distance. The body was subsequently buried at Wareham. The Castle was built on the summit of a hill, and a splendid selection the builder made in the choice of the site. King John made the castle his residence, and converted it into a state prison, confining and starving to death no less than twenty-two French noblemen. On the death of King John the Castle passed into the hands of the Earl of Pembroke. In the reign of Elizabeth the Castle was granted to Sir Christopher Hatton, by whom it was repaired. In the reign of Charles the First, the Castle became the property of Sir John Bankes. The history of the Castle consists of treachery, tortures, conspiracies, heartless cruelties, and murders. It played a very important part in the Civil War, being for a long time courageously defended against the Parliamentary forces by Lady Bankes, who was only defeated at length by the treachery of an officer named Pitman. Hutchings, the county historian, thus graphically describes the action of the rebellious forces: "The rebels being possessed of it, plundered it, undermined and threw down, or blew up with gunpowder the walls and towers. Thus this ancient and magnificent fabric was reduced to a heap of ruins, and remains a lasting monument of the dreadful effects of anarchy and rebellion and the rage of civil war. The ruins are large, and allowed to be the noblest in the kingdom, considering the extent of ground on which they stand. Their high situation makes them visible at a great distance. The vast fragments of the King's Tower, the round towers, leaning as if ready to fall, the broken walls and vast pieces of them tumbled down into the vale below, form such a scene of havoc and desolation as strike every curious spectator with horror and concern." When the Castle fell into the hands of the Parliament, Oliver Cromwell ordered it to be at once destroyed. During the spring of 1883, some lads who were visiting the ruins of Corfe Castle, noticed a small portion of the stonework facing the staircase wall fall to the ground, and on looking up at the spot from whence the stones fell, saw projecting from the masonry what they thought appeared like part of the shell of a cocoa nut. On calling the attention of the warden of the castle to the circumstance he obtained a long pole, and by the use of it succeeded in bringing to the ground not a cocoa nut, but a round shot or cannon ball. From the position in which it was embedded there can be little doubt it, with others of the kind, were fired by Cromwell's men at the staircase, the object being to destroy this, and so cut off the communication with the King's Tower in order to make prisoners of those at the time in that part of the castle. From its reduced size by means of the rust and corrosion of some 250 years, it is impossible to guess at the original weight and dimensions of the shot. It has been handed over to Mr. Bankes, the owner of the castle, who has deposited it at his seat at Kingston Lacy, where the ancient keys and seals of the castle are preserved.

WIMBORNE.

THE little Town of Wimborne, in Dorset, probably takes its name from a river now called the Allen, which was formerly known as the Wim. It was a place of some importance in the time of the Romans, now being a quiet little town, nestling among the hills under the shadow of its grand old Minster Towers. There are several places of interest besides the old Minster. On leaving the railway station we turn to the left. After crossing the Stour, we pass the picturesque lodge and enter the spacious drive which leads to Canford Manor, (the residence of Lord Wimborne); most of the mansion is comparatively modern. It was built in 1826, on the site of a convent; and some parts may be considered ancient, the kitchen of John of Gaunt, together with all the culinary apparatus in use at that period, may still be seen in good preservation. The grounds are beautifully laid out and kept in perfect order, the Magnolia Walk being specially noted. Adjoining the conservatories, there is a small Ninevah Court, built for the reception of curiosities and hieroglyphical tablets, and collected at Ninevah, and presented by Sir Henry Layard to Lord Wimborne; the small picturesque church (lately restored), is also of ancient date and stands in the manor grounds. Merly House, situated about one mile from Wimborne Station, is also the property of Lord Wimborne, and contains some valuable paintings by Hogarth. In the winter there is good skating on the Merly Pond. The game is strictly preserved; but fishing may be obtained by permission. The next place of interest is Dean's Court, the property of the Hannam family, situated a little south from the church, formerly a Decanal residence till the suppression of that office, and was connected to the Minster by a subterranean passage, which is now blocked up. The present structure was erected by Sir W. Hannam, in 1725, and contains an unbroken series of family portraits, dating back to Queen Elizabeth's time. Matthew Prior, one of the early poets, is supposed to have been born at Abbott House, near Wimborne. Here also a Roman urn containing numerous silver coins, of the date of the Emperor Galerius, was accidentally discovered by a labourer, and claimed by Sir John Bankes, then Lord of the Manor of Kingston Lacy. The mansion house of the Bankes family, stands nearly in the centre of a beautifully wooded park, containing some magnificent cedars of Lebanon. There is a splendid staircase of white Carrara marble, 30 feet wide; the staircase is from the central hall to the second floor profusely decorated with art treasures from all parts of the World. There is a very valuable collection of pictures by celebrated artists, amongst others Raphael, Rubens, Murillo, Vandyck, Salvator Rosa, Sir Peter Lely and Gainsborough are represented, some of which at one time decorated the walls of the now ruined fortress of Corfe Castle; there are shown also the keys and seals of that noted citadel Corfe Castle, which was so nobly defended, by brave Dame Mary, the gallant wife of Sir John Bankes. In the grounds may be seen a sarcophagus of granite; also an Egyptian obelisk, with some old inscriptions, brought from Nubia. The house was built in 1663. Charborough House is about three miles distant. In the park is an obelisk which can be seen for miles around. Crichel House, the seat of Lord Alington, is about five miles from Wimborne. It is beautifully situated in a well wooded park. In the grounds are several trees which were planted by various royal visitors, at different times. The Prince and Princess of Wales, the Duke and Duchess of Connaught, and other members of the Royal House, have from time to time been entertained within the hospitable walls of this beautiful mansion. The late Lord Beaconsfield was also a very honoured guest. The large artificial lake near the mansion, is the undisturbed home of great varieties of wild fowl. The gardens and greenhouses are also very beautiful.

The neighbourhood of Wimborne is particularly rich in ferns and wild flowers, 14 varieties being found, including the majestic royal fern and the delicate little maidenhair spleenwort, there are also flowers in wild profusion and some of them rather rare such as blue gentian and snowflakes. The lanes and roads are very pleasant and well shaded with trees and are delightful for walking; whilst in some directions the heathland and pine woods make a pleasing variety, and the winding river completes the picture.

THE MINSTER.

The Church of Wimborne is mentioned in Domesday Book, and mention is also made of a deanery here early in the reign of King Henry III. In the eleventh year of the reign of Edward II. the King by his letters patent declared it to be his free chapel, and as such the prebend and chapels belonging to it were to be exempt from all ordinary jurisdiction, imposition, &c., and ordained that none should presume to encroach upon their immunities.

The Church as it now stands is cruciform, and consists of a central lantern tower, nave and choir, transepts without aisles, western or bell tower, north and south porches, crypt, and vestry or sacristy with the library over it.

The dimensions of the building are as follows:—Interior length, 182 feet; across the transepts, 102 feet; length of choir, 33 feet; of nave, 67 feet; tower, 30 feet square; width of nave and aisles, 51 feet; west tower, 31 feet square. It is worthy of notice that in the construction of the several additions to the fabric of the church, during the 300 years occupied in the building, the several architects had the good taste to work out the characteristics of the different styles of architecture, that the natural diversity has made one noble pile, without interfering with the original design. The central tower is the oldest part and was built in 1100. The western tower was added in 1450, and some of the other parts about 1714. Nearly the whole of the fabric was restored in 1857. A very attractive and important addition has been made to the venerable edifice by the erection of a handsome reredos of fine mosaic work. The church contains some very handsome monuments, beautiful stained windows, and many old curiosities. Amongst the tombs may be mentioned that of JOHN DE BEAUFORT, Duke of Somerset, and his Duchess MARGARET. The figures are sculptured in alabaster, and although somewhat defaced, are still in a tolerably good state of preservation. The altar tomb of GERTRUDE, Marchioness of Exeter. A brass plate in the floor marks the last resting place of King ETHELRED, who was killed in a battle with the Danes, at Merton. A monument to THOMAS HANNAM and his wife who are represented as praying. The tomb of ANTHONY ETTRICKE, the first recorder of Poole, and the magistrate who committed the Duke of Monmouth, is under the south-west window. The inhabitants of Wimborne having offended Ettricke, he declared he would not be buried in their church or churchyard, over the ground or beneath it, and obtained permission to open the wall on a level with the ground, where he saw the coffin placed during his lifetime. The deed is still preserved, conveying 20s. annually to the churchwardens to keep his tomb in repair.

In the south choir aisle is a strong chest or box of ancient construction. It consists of a solid log of oak in which was hewn out a space for the security of deeds, the stout lid being well secured by strong hinges and six locks. What would have happened if some pagan had carried off the log, hinges and locks and all, we will not venture to discuss, the very idea is too dreadful to contemplate. Two bulky old parish chests are also preserved here.

Once upon a time there stood near the choir the large marble tomb of JOHN DE BERWICK. The chief interest centering here was not in the tomb, however, but in the use to which it was put. Here the inhabitants met to receive the accounts of the old churchwardens and to elect the new; to grant leases of church property; to receive fines and rents, and to inquire into parochial matters in general.

Another spot of very great interest is the library. When we remember the cost of books when the art of printing was yet in its infancy, it was no small boon to the people of Wimborne in those days to have the free use of this library. The books were presented to the town in 1686, by the Rev. William Stone, and are a lasting monument to his memory. Books were books in those days and some of the most valuable were secured by chains to iron rods. There are about 243 vols. in the library. The oldest volume is an entire manuscript of date 1343, a Polyglot Bible in seven languages of date 1657; the New Testament in five languages, lexicon in seven languages, 1669; and a black letter bible of date 1595. A fine copy of Sir Walter Raleigh's History of the World will be found there. It has been recorded that the poet Prior spent a great deal of time in the library, and that once when reading by the light of a candle he fell asleep, the light fell and burned through 104 of the pages. He very neatly and very patiently restored it, by placing fresh paper over the holes, and supplying the missing text with the greatest minuteness with his pen. There are other curiosities in the library, chiefly unearthed at the late excavations.

The belfry in the western tower has a chime of eight bells. The history of this tower is very interesting having been a long time in building. The walls are nearly six feet thick at the base, supported by a large turret buttress at each angle of the tower. Hints as to its stability, however, began to be made, until we come to the following curious entry in 1664 :—

“ Paid in beere to the ringers for a peale to trye if the tower shooke, 1s.”

In the interior of this tower, in connection with the clock, is a curious old lunar orrery of the 14th century. It shows the position of the sun and moon, the age of the moon, &c. There are only two other orreries of this kind in England; one in Wells and the other in York Cathedrals. On the north side of the tower in connection with the clock stands the figure of a sentinel, popularly known as a quarter-jack, who has faithfully recorded the flight of time every quarter-of-an-hour for hundreds of years.

There are now thirty-four stained glass windows in the church, the subjects of which are well worked out. With the exception of one or two all the windows were the gifts of private individuals.

The **Grammar School** was formerly founded by Queen Elizabeth who willed that “ such school should from thenceforth be called the Grammar School of the foundation of Queen Elizabeth in Wimborne, in the County of Dorset.” The new school buildings are in the Elizabethan style, and were opened in 1851. There are now about 100 scholars in the school, who pay three guineas a year for instruction in French, Mathematics and English, the classics being taught free to boys between the ages of eight and eighteen.

Wimborne appears to have had her share in the troubles of the Great Rebellion; but being a quiet little place and not being engaged in actual warfare escaped without much injury. The accounts tell us of the haste the poor dead king's arms were painted out, and with equal speed they were painted in again when the new king came back. It may be therefore inferred that Wimborne adapted herself to the times—like the Vicar of Bray—and did not exert herself to oppose either the King or the Protector.

Badbury Rings, situated about four miles from Wimborne, supposed to be an old British garrison, altered by the Romans on their Conquest. There are three rings, the outer of which is about a mile in circumference. Originally there were two openings. There have been various Roman coins dug up at Badbury from time to time.

Poole, Parkstone, & Brownsea Island.

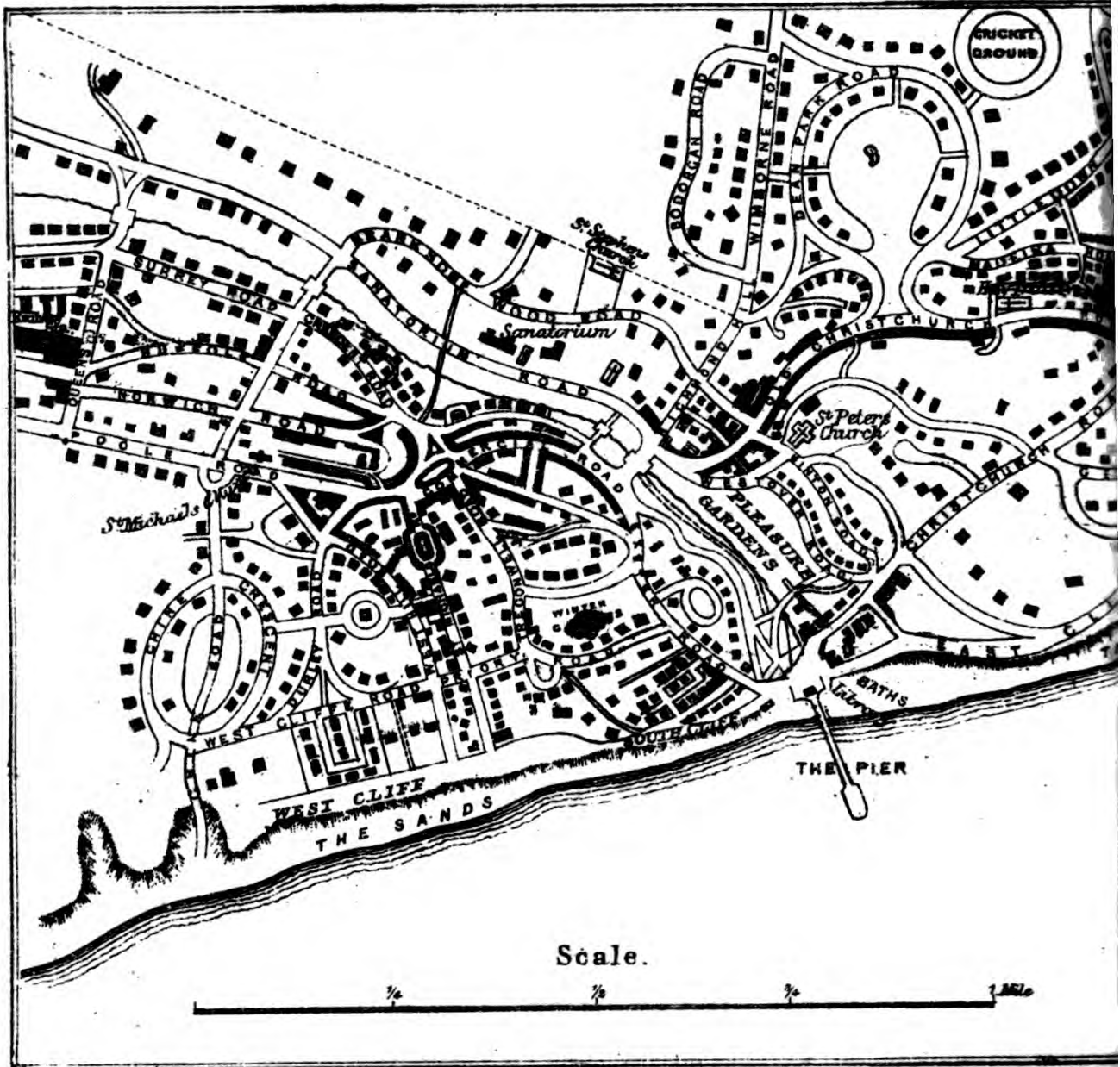
POOLE is a town and county, a seaport and a Parliamentary Borough, situated about five miles to the west of Bournemouth. It derives its name from its convenient harbour, and boasts of but little in historical fame. During the reign of Edward the Third, it came into its first importance as a fishing hamlet, by furnishing four ships and 94 men towards the armament of that sovereign for the Siege of Calais, and during the civil war of the 17th century, the town was fortified and garrisoned for the Parliament, and became the scene of many contests severe and sanguinary; but after the Restoration, the fortifications, of which a small portion are still discernible, were demolished in 1349. It suffered greatly from the “ Black death,” the victims of which were buried on that projecting slip of land, known as the “ the Baiter.” Poole was much decayed in the time of Leland who speaks of it as a “ poore fisshar village;” for a more complete historical description we would refer the reader to Leland. Its foreign trade for a long time was with

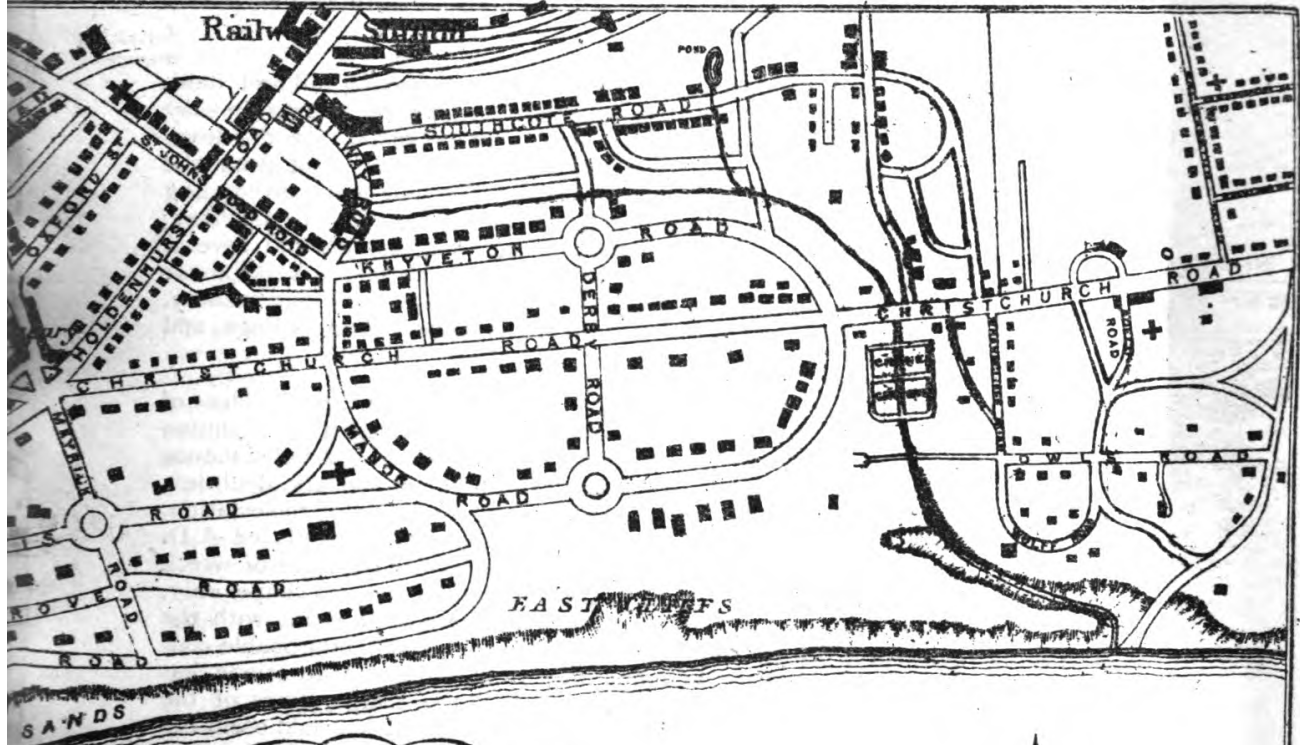

From Actual Survey

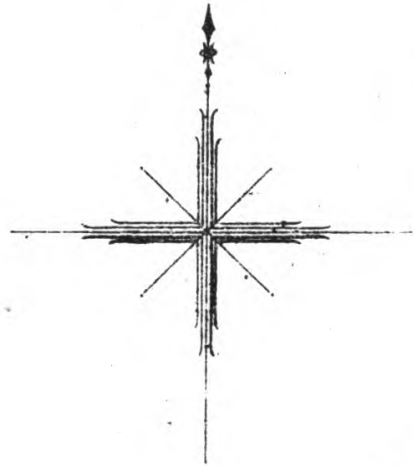

Newfoundland and the Mediterranean; but on the fall of Napoleon I. it began to decline and is now nearly extinct. A considerable coasting trade is, however, still carried on. It is a busy commercial and manufacturing town. Within the last few years Potteries have sprung into active operation, one at Saltern Lake, at Hamworthy, at Branksea Island and at Bourne Valley. Its exports are chiefly pottery goods and clay, manufactured goods, grain, timber, stone, leather, &c., while its imports are principally timber, iron, coal, corn, pitch, tar, oil, &c. The High Street is wide, well drained and is supplied with many large and attractive shops. The population of Poole is about 11,000. The waters of Poole Harbour cover the enormous area of 10,000 acres, and the distance round it about 100 miles. For information concerning the places of worship, the hotels, institutes, &c., please see pages 93 and 94.

PARKSTONE, this charming little village nestling quietly among hill and dale, is situated about midway between Bournemouth and Poole, and within easy access of either place (via road or rail.) It is one of those spots, that the lover of nature should not fail to visit, it abounds in exquisite scenery, and from the summit of Constitution Hill a very fine view of Poole Harbour and surrounding country can be obtained. It has a handsome church, dedicated to St. Peter; Congregational and Wesleyan Chapels, a post office, hotel, school and several institutions. The climate is delightful and healthy. There are pretty walks about Parkstone, some through spacious fields of green, others through woodland scenery, &c., and taking it altogether "England's Mentone" is a very pretty village, and well worthy of a visit.

HISTORICAL SKETCH OF BROWNSEA ISLAND.—The first incident of note recorded concerning the Island is that Canute landed upon it. Canutus having spoiled the church and monastery of Cerne, took the haven and sailed thence to Branksea. His force, being laden with the spoils of the monastery, doubtless found the little island a safe retreat. Here they could, without fear of molestation, mature plans for further marauding expeditions. The above event is placed A.D. 1015. In 1154 King Henry II. granted to the Abbot of Cerne the right of wreck on the Island. Leland says—"The Island had in it no building save a chapel only, for an hermit, it longeth to Cerne Abbey." Coupling the King's grant with the Abbot of Cerne building a Chapel and Hermitage, it seems a not improbable conclusion that the duties of the Hermit were not only to attend to his devotions, but also to keep a sharp look out after the wreck. In 1293, the temporalities of the Abbot here were valued at 51s. 11d. For some 350 years, then, it would seem the Abbots of Cerne maintained the chapel and hermitage, and looked after the "Wreck." After the dissolution of the Monasteries, Henry VIII. granted the Island, and the water surrounding it, to John, Earl of Oxford. From that time to the present proprietor, the Right Honourable George Augustus Frederick Cavendish Bentinck, M.P. for Whitehaven, counting from the Abbot of Cerne, are eighteen owners or proprietors. In the 15th year of Elizabeth's reign the annual value of the Island, then probably little better than a sandbank, was estimated at nine shillings, which, allowing for the difference in the value of money, may be called nine pounds. In the 9th year of the reign of James I. this Island and the bill or town of Poole, late the possessions of Charles Brook, were granted to Robert, Earl of Salisbury. In the reign of Charles II. it belonged to Sir Robert Clayton, of whose heirs it was purchased about 1726 for £300, by William Benson, Esq., auditor of the imprest. In 1762 the Island was conveyed to Sir Gerard Napier and Humphrey Sturt, Esq., to the last of whom, upon the death of the former, the whole property devolved. "He afterwards," says Hutchings, made great additions to the castle, preserving the great hall built by Auditor Benson, and made great plantations of various kinds of trees; manured and cultivated it with different kinds of agriculture with so much success, that this Island, which hitherto had lain rude and uncultivated, covered with heath and furze, begins to receive the improvements of art, and may in a few years repay the vast labour and cost bestowed upon it." The Island is one of those delightfully quiet spots where man weary with the toil of this busy world, could find inexhaustible pleasure and solace to the mind. But Brownsea is not public, so therefore you must not venture without permission. It is the property of the Right Hon. G. A. F. Cavendish

Bentinck, M.P., and in a picturesque and secluded sylvan dell, is a charming villa, grand in construction and foreign in semblance, this gentleman and his family sometimes reside. The scenery is diverting, an everchanging panoramic display, enchanting in its originality. The climatic influences are to be compared to those of Bournemouth. The Mirror or "Clear Lake" is a great attraction, for here we see the Swiss Cottage and "Bridge of the Rialto" in their second self. The Castle—It is believed that the great tower was built towards the end of the reign of Henry VIII. (1545). It is an imposing structure and in good state of preservation. The castle has been occupied by Sir Charles Chad, Bart., by the Right Hon. Sir Augustus Foster, Bart., who died at the castle in 1848, and by Colonel Waugh. St. Mary's Church, which was built by Col. Waugh, is of decorative Gothic, stands on a beautifully selected site in the midst of a clump of lofty fir trees on the north-eastern part of the island, is handsome in appearance and lovely in situation, and furnished in an imposing and complete style. It is surrounded by "God's acre" adorned with neat monuments and bright cheerful little gardens. The foundation stone was laid by Major-General Sir Harry Smith, G.C.B., in 1853. On the handsome urns that stand on the churchyard gate, are inscribed in old English characters the words—"Ask and ye shall receive, Seek and ye shall find, Knock and it shall be opened." The Wells, some seven or eight are mentioned, the most remarkable being the Red Marble Well in the conservatory, purchased by the Right Hon. G. C. Bentinck, M.P., in 1874, out of the Palace Cantarnie della Zoga, at St. Giovanni Paolo at Venice. It is believed that this well was executed by the same artist as the one still existing in "Ca' d' Ore." Buildings—Every building is of its kind "a thing of beauty," from the magnificent Tudor-fronted Castle down to the humble cottage, with its gracefully curling smoke. And amongst all the buildings none is more compact than the castellated Villino, with its ports prepared for cannon, and its stone steps plunging down into the rapid eddies of the sea. No ship can reach the harbour of Poole without being distinctly seen, and accordingly the Villino was once the chosen residence of the chief of the coastguards, who kept his eye open for smugglers in those delightful times. The Crystal Arcade contains numerous art treasures, is a well planned structure and forms a covered way from the postern door of the castle to the sea at the Bath-steps. Its interior is prolific in art treasures: Colossal white statues in marble of Pan and a Water Nymph, Flora and Ceres, Hebe, Hercules, Moses, St. Christopher, the winged lion of St. Mark, &c., &c. The pillars are surmounted by elaborately carved capitals, while on the left, the Lavatory Fountain rising tier above tier give an excellent Sermon in stone—"Unless you wash your mind, Foul with crime thou wilt go."
